THE COACHES

▶Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 97-67 (.591).

▶Dave Arseneault (Colby 1976) is in his 25th season at Grinnell and has a record of 328-246 (571).

THE SERIES

In a series that dates back to 1940, Lawrence has a 50-49 edge against Grinnell. Lawrence, which has won two consecutive games against the Pioneers, has a 19-12 mark against Grinnell's "system" during the tenures of head coach Joel DePagter and his predecessor, John Tharp.

LAST GAME

Lawrence held off several secondhalf challenges and went on to an 84-76 Midwest Conference win over Lake Forest on Wednesday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Senior guard Chris Siebert scored 22 points and moved into fourth place on Lawrence's career scoring

list. Siebert now has 1,343 points, one better than Doug Fyfe, who starred for the Vikings from 1972-76.

rebounds for Lawrence, and Ryan DePouw had 12 points, a game-high six assists and five rebounds. Chase Nelson chipped in with 12 points and Trace Sonnleitner had 10.

James Stack paced Lake Forest with 22 points, including nine in the final 43 seconds.

Lawrence trailed by two at the half, but the Vikings went on an 11-1 run early in the half to take a 52-41

lead. Siebert, Sonnleitner and Troy Miller all hit 3-pointers during that stretch.

Lake Forest trimmed the margin back to three points at 52-49, but the Vikings countered with a 12-4 run, capped by Nikitas' three-point play, for a 64-53 edge with 5:25 left.

The Foresters immediately came back to cut the lead to 66-61 on Andrew Toth's 3-pointer with 4:12 remaining. DePouw then hit a driving layup and Max Burgess buried a 3-pointer and Lawrence led 71-61 with 2:20 left.

The Vikings then made 11-of-12 free throws in the final 1:30 to seal the victory.

VIKINGS UPDATE

Lawrence did what it needed to do on Wednesday with a win over Lake Forest, but the Vikings didn't get any help from Beloit or Cornell. Lawrence



was eliminated from contention for the Midwest Conference Tournament berth after Carroll won at Beloit and Grinnell defeated visiting Cornell to secure the final two tourney spots.

- Lawrence's victory over Lake Forest gave the Vikings their longest win streak of the season at four games. The Vikings have knocked off Illinois College, Beloit, Cornell and Lake Forest in the last 12 days.
- Lawrence has been exceptionally good in the last four games. During that stretch, the Vikings have shot 52.2 percent from the floor, 43.2 percent on 3-pointers and 75.2 percent from the foul line.
- ▶Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) will finish his career fourth in scoring at Lawrence. Siebert moved past Doug Fyfe (1,342) with 22 points against Lake Forest and now has 1,343 points. The top three players on the list all have more than 1,500 points.

▶Siebert also will be one of the most prolific 3-point shooters in school history. Siebert made three 3-pointers against Lake Forest and has 69 on the season. That is the second-highest season total in school history and is six short of John Dekker's school record of 75, set in 2009-10. Siebert now has 186 3-pointers in his career, which is the third-highest total in school history. Lawrence Hall of Famer Joel Dillingham is the leader with 212 and Dekker is second at 190.

Siebert posted his 10th 20-plus scoring game of the season against Lake Forest. He leads the team in scoring at

18.0 points per game, and that ranks seventh in the conference. Siebert is shooing 47.4 percent from the floor, including 46.6 percent on 3-pointers, and is hitting 81.4 percent from the foul line.

▶ Junior forward Ryan DePouw (Oconto, Wis./Oconto) put together a superb all-around game against Lake Forest with 12 points, six assists, five rebounds Ryan DePouw and two steals. De-



Pouw is 16th in the league in scoring at 15.1 points per game and is shooting 53.0 percent from the floor.

▶The Vikings played without injured senior quard Brian Gryszkiewicz (Menomonee Falls, Wis./Sussex Hamilton) against Lake Forest. Gryszkiewicz leads the team and ranks fourth in the league at 3.9 assists per game. DePouw and Siebert picked up the slack by handing out six and five assists, respectively.

▶Sophomore guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, III./Glenbrook South) leads the team and the conference at 2.5 steals per game. Nikitas is third on the team in scor- Jamie Nikitas ing at 14.1 points per



game and is averaging a team-best 5.7 rebounds per contest.

Lawrence ranks fifth in the league in scoring offense at 79.7 points per game. The Vikings are fifth in scoring defense at 76.1 points per game.

▶The Vikings are fourth in the league field goal percentage at 49.9 percent and third in 3-point shooting at 40.6 percent. The Vikings rank fifth in field goal percentage defense at 46.4 percent and sixth in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 38.4 percent.

SCOUTING GRINNELL

▶Grinnell clinched a berth in the Midwest Conference Tournament on Wednesday with a 107-93 victory over visiting Cornell.



Luke Yaeger scored 21 points to pace Grinnell, and the nation's leading scorer, Jack Taylor was limited to 15 points as he hit only 3-of-20 shots from the floor. Nick Bobb had a big game for Cornell with 24 points and 13 rebounds.

▶Grinnell will now be jockeying for position in the conference tournament. St. Norbert will host the tournament next weekend, but it's possible that the other three teams could be tied with 12-6 marks. Carroll is done with its schedule at 12-6 and Ripon travels to Knox, which is in the conference cellar.

- Senior guard Patrick Maher leads the conference and the nation at 8.0 assists per game.
- The top rebounder for the Pioneers is Aaron Levin, who is at 6.4 per game. That ranks seventh in the conference.
- ▶Grinnell leads the Midwest Conference and the nation in scoring at 117.7 points per game. The Pioneers are last in scoring defense at 108.0 points per game.
- ▶Grinnell is shooting 43.7 percent from the floor, which ranks ninth in the Midwest Conference. The Pioneers are hitting on 36.2 percent of their 3-pointers, which is sixth in the league.
- ▶Grinnell is last in the conference in field goal percentage defense at 59.3 percent. The Pioneers are 10th in the league in defending the 3-pointers at 39.7 percent.
