- ▶Ryan Kane (St. Norbert 1999) is in his second season at Ripon and has a record of 22-16 (.579).
- ▶ Kevin Walden (Knox 2001) is in his second season at Knox and has a record of 2-35 (.054). He is in his sixth season overall and has a record of 45-89 (.336).

THE SERIES

- ▶In a series that goes back to 1906, Ripon has a 133-81 edge over the Vikings. Over the last decade, Lawrence has an 11-8 advantage.
- ▶ Knox holds a 61-53 edge in the series that dates back to 1925. Lawrence has

won four straight in the series and 20 of the last 23.

LAST GAME

Six players scored in double figures as Lawrence rolled to a 111-94 Midwest Conference victory over Grinnell this past Saturday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Chris Siebert posted a doubledouble with 23 points and 11 rebounds to lead Lawrence. Ryan De-Pouw also had a double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds, and he added four assists.

Jamie Nikitas picked up 22 points for the Vikings, and Tyler Mazur had 18. Chase Nelson chipped in with 14 points, and Brian Gryszkiewicz had 12 points and five assists.

The nation's scoring leader, Grinnell's Jack Taylor, led the Pioneers with 31 points. Aaron Levin added 17 points, and Luke Yaeger had 16 for Grinnell.

Lawrence jumped to an early lead, using an 11-4 run to build a 20-10 advantage with 13:39 left. Grinnell trimmed the lead back to three at 33-30, but the Vikings then took control.

Lawrence outscored the Pioneers 26-13 over the final 4:45 of the first half to grab a 67-48 lead at the break. Mazur scored 10 points during that stretch and Nikitas had five for the Vikings.

The Vikings then stretched that lead over the first seven minutes of the second half. After Yeager made a 3-pointer to start the half for Grinnell, Lawrence went on a 22-6 run and led 89-57 with 12:35 remaining. Nelson scored eight points during that run, including a dunk, and Siebert scored six during that stretch.

Grinnell never got closer than the final margin of 17 points.

VIKINGS UPDATE

▶Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./ Baraboo) scored team-high 23 points in the victory over Grinnell and moved past

- ▶Lawrence has two of the top three players in the league in steals. Nikitas leads the league at 2.3 steals per game, and Gryszkiewicz is third at 1.8.
- Lawrence ranks fifth in the Miwest Conference in scoring offense at 79.2 points per game. The Vikings are fifth in scoring defense at 75.7 points per contest.
- ▶The Vikings are fourth in the league field goal percentage at 49.4 percent and fifth in 3-point shooting at 38.2 percent. The Vikings rank fourth in field goal percentage defense at 44.6 percent and sixth in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 38.1 percent.

- ▶Ripon rebounded nicely after getting roughed up at St. Norbert in its previous game. The Green Knights led Ripon 45-9 to start the game and went on to a 102-62 victory.
- ▶Guard Kyle Loughrin is tops on the team and ranks 11th in the conference in scoring at 16.6 points per game. Ty Sabin and Ty Ketz are both in double figures as well. Sabin is at 16.1 and Ketz is at 14.3.
- Loughrin and Sabin are tied for the team lead at 2.5 assists per game.
- Forward Brad Brooks leads the team in rebounding at 6.6 per game, and that ranks fifth in the conference.
- ▶Ripon is fourth in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 80.1 points per game. The Red Hawks are fourth in scoring defense at 74.9.

- ▶Ripon is shooting 49.9 percent from the floor, which ranks third in the league. Ripon is eighth in field goal percentage defense at 50.1 percent. Ripon is third in 3-point shooting at 39.7 percent and ranks first in 3-point defense at 34.1 percent.

SCOUTING KNOX

▶Knox enters the game at Lawrence on a 12-game los- Prairie Fire ing streak. The



Prairie Fire dropped a 68-47 decision to visiting Carroll last Saturday. Kevin Hurd paced Carroll with 18 points, and Eric Miller scored a game-high 21 points for Knox.

- ▶Knox has a trio of players averaging double figures in points. David Jones is tops at 12.9 points per game, followed by Eric Miller at 11.3 and Mitch Murphy at 10.4.
- ▶ Miller is second in the league in freethrow shooting at 91.9 percent (34-37).
- ▶Knox has been getting hurt on the glass this season, and the Prairie Fire is a minus-8.7 in rebounding margin. Jones is the top rebounder at 6.1 per game.
- ▶Knox ranks last in the league in scoring offense at 66.2 points per game. The Prairie Fire is 10th in scoring defense at 87.1 points per contest.
- ▶Knox is the worst-shooting team in the league at 41.1 percent. Knox is 10th in the league in field goal percentage defense at 52.8 percent. The Prairie Fire is shooting 32.6 percent from beyond the arc, and that ranks 10th in the league. Knox is ninth in defending the 3-pointer at 40 percent.


