THE COACHES

▶Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 87-59 (.596).

- ▶ Chad Murray (Chapman 1998) is in his fifth season at Cornell and has a record of 37-67 (.356).
- ▶ Kevin Walden is in his second season at Knox and has a record of 2-27 (.069). He is in his sixth season overall with a record of 45-81 (.357).
- ► Mike Worrell (Urbana 1986) is in his 18th season at Illinois College and has a record of 172-227 (.431).

THE SERIES

- ▶In a series that goes back to 1923, Cornell holds a 58-28 lead in the rivalry with Lawrence. The Vikings have won the last two meetings with the Rams.
- ▶Knox holds a 61-52 lead in the series that goes back to 1924. Lawrence has dominated the series in recent years and have won three in a row and 19 of the last 22 against the Prairie Fire.
- Lawrence has a 28-10 edge against Illinois College in a series that started in 1985. Lawrence has won four straight against the Blueboys and 16 of the last 18.

LAST GAME

Jamie Nikitas and Tyler Mazur led four Lawrence players in double figures as the Vikings downed Carroll 76-67 in a Midwest Conference game on Dec. 4 at Alexander Gymnasium.

Nikitas scored a game-high 22 points and Mazur added 21 as Lawrence rallied past the Pioneers in the second half. Ryan DePouw added 18 points and Chris Siebert chipped in with 12 for Lawrence.

DePouw went 4-for-4 from 3-point range, and Mazur hit 4 of 9 from beyond the arc. Nikitas added six rebounds, five steals and four assists for the Vikings.

Bryan Nagy paced Carroll with 17 points and was one of four Pioneers in double figures.

Carroll led 33-28 at the half, but the Vikings pulled away midway through the second half. The score was tied at 41-41 when Lawrence went on a 9-0 run. Mazur scored five points in the run, including a 3-pointer to finish it,

and Nikitas added four.

The Pioneers whittled the lead back down to 54-51 with 5:31 remaining, but DePouw buried a 3-pointer from the corner to answer for the Vikings. Lawrence still led by six at the 2:23 mark when Mazur converted a three-point play off a fastbreak to give the Vikings a 68-59 lead.

After a Carroll layup, Mazur buried another 3-pointer late in the shot clock to push Lawrence's lead to 71-61 with 1:56 remaining. Carroll never got closer than nine points the rest of the way.

▶With Lawrence's win over Carroll last week, the Vikings are 7-0 in Midwest Conference openers under head coach Joel DePagter.




▶ Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) moved up two spots on the career scoring list after scoring 12 points in the win over Carroll. Siebert Chris Siebert now has 1,031 points and is tied for 18th



with Bob Townsend. Siebert is closing in on Strat Warden (1,042) and recent star Jason Holinbeck (1,051).

- ▶Siebert leads the team and ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 20.8 points per game.
- Lawrence is a minus-4.0 in rebounding margin this season, and the Vikings do not have a player in the top 20 in rebounding in the conference. Guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, III./ Glenbrook South) leads the team at 5.0 rebounds per game, and Siebert and Ryan DePouw (Oconto, Wis./ Oconto) are tied for second at 4.8 per contest.
- ▶Senior guard Brian Gryszkiewicz (Menomonee Falls, Wis./Sussex Hamilton) leads the team in steals at 3.8 per game, and that ranks sixth in the conference.
- ▶Nikitas is tops in the league at 3.5 steals per game. The Vikings rank third in the conference at 6.5 steals per contest.

- ▶Greenwood leads the Pioneers in scoring at 19.8 points per game, and that ranks sixth in the conference. The 5-foot-8 Greenwood also is fourth on the team in rebounding at 4.2 per
- Forwards Joey Guth and Nick Bobb are also scoring double figures in points. Guth is at 16.2 points per game, and Bobb is at 14.6. Bobb is pulling down a team-best 7.2 rebounds per game.
- ▶Cornell has two of the league's top free-throw shooters in Bobb and Greenwood. Bobb is at 89.5 percent (17-19) and Greenwood is at 86.1 percent (31-36).
- ▶ Cornell is sixth in the league in scoring offense at 79.2 points per game. The Rams are second in scoring defense at 67.2.
- ▶ Cornell is shooting 46.2 percent from the floor, and that ranks seventh in the conference. The Rams are third in field goal percentage defense at 42.2 percent.
- ▶ Cornell ranks second in the league in 3-point shooting at 39.2 percent, and the Rams are third in defending the 3-pointer at 35.5 percent.

- ▶Jones also leads the team in rebounding at 5.2 per game. Miller is tops on the squad at 2.7 assists per contest.
- ▶Knox is ninth in the league in scoring offense at 70.2 points per game. The Prairie Fire is ninth in scoring defense at 88.6 per contest.
- ▶Knox is shooting 42.9 percent from the floor, and that ranks 10th in the conference. Knox also is 10th in field goal percentage defense at 55.9 percent.
- The Prairie Fire is seventh in the league in 3-point shooting at 35.2 percent. Knox ranks 10th in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 47.4 percent.
- ▶Knox continues in full rebuilding mode under second-year head coach Kevin Walden, who played for long-time coach Tim Heimann. The Prairie Fire hasn't posted a winning record since going 15-8 in 1999-2000 and hasn't had a non-losing season since going 12-12 in 2005-06.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS COLLEGE

Illinois College will be coming off a nine-day break when the Blueboys come to Appleton next Monday. Illinois College's last game



was an 85-62 loss at Ripon on Dec. 7. Ty Ketz led five Ripon players in double figures with 20 points in the Red Hawks' victory. Brandon Berry scored 18 points to pace the Blueboys.

- ▶Brandon Berry leads the team and ranks second in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 23.2 points per game. Berry also is the top rebounder on the team and is fourth in the league at 7.0 rebounds per game.
- ▶Guard Nathan Kohler leads the team and the Midwest Conference in assists at 7.2 per game. The Blueboys lead the league at 22.8 assists per game.
- Illinois College ranks second in the league in scoring offense at 98.6 points per game. The Blueboys have score more than 100 points in all three of their victories this season. The Blueboys are eighth in scoring defense at 87.4 points per game.
- ▶Illinois College ranks third in the league in field goal percentage at 49.7 percent. The Blueboys rank seventh in the league in field goal percentage defense at 49.8 percent.
- The Blueboys lead the league in 3-point shooting at 41.0 percent. Illinois College is eighth in the league in defending the 3-pointer at 43.4 percent.
