THE COACHES

▶Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his eighth season at Lawrence and has a record of 104-79 (.568).

▶Gary Grzesk (UWGB 1996) is in his ninth season at St. Norbert and has a record of 162-57 (.740) with the Green Knights. Grzesk is in his 12th season overall and has a record of 213-88 (.708).

▶Mike Worrell (Urbana 1986) is in his 19th season at Illinois College and has a record of 186-249 (.428).

THE SERIES

▶In a series that dates back to 1918, St. Norbert holds a 54-46 edge over the Vikings. The Green Knights have won

11 consecutive games in the series.

►Lawrence has a 31-10 advantage over Illinois College in a series that started in the 1985-86 season. The Vikings have won seven consecutive games and 19 of the last 21 over the Blueboys.

LAST GAME

Four Lawrence players scored in double figures, and the Vikings used that balanced attack to post a 76-60 Midwest Conference victory over Knox this past Saturday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Trace Sonnleitner led Lawrence with a game-high 19 points. Troy Miller added 13 points and seven rebounds for the Vikings, and Ryan DePouw and Jeremy Stephani scored 10 points apiece. DePouw also posted game highs with eight rebounds and five assists.

Mitch Murphy paced Knox with 14 points and five rebounds, and Deandre Weathersby added 10 points and four assists.

Lawrence grabbed the advantage early and kept the Prairie Fire at arm's length throughout the game. DePouw scored five points in a 10-0 Lawrence run that gave the Vikings a 20-10 lead with 9:16 left in the opening half.

Knox closed to six points late in the first half before Sonnleitner's layup gave Lawrence a 34-26 lead at the break.

Sonnleitner gave the Vikings a boost early in the second half as Lawrence went on a 12-2 scoring run. Sonnleitner scored seven points in that run and Andrew Borresen hit a 3-pointer before Jamie Nikitas capped the outburst with a layup to give Lawrence a 46-30 edge.

Knox trimmed the lead to 46-34, but Lawrence immediately stretched the lead back to 56-37. Knox closed the margin to 64-52 with 6:41 left, but Stephani answered with a 3-pointer. Knox didn't get closer than 16 points

Lake Forest to score a game-high 19 points in Lawrence's win over Knox. Sonnleitner has scored in double figures in six of Lawrence's seven victories this season. He improved his season scoring average to 13.4 points per game, which ranks 16th in the Midwest Conference.

►Freshman guard Jeremy Stephani (Arlington Heights, Ill./Wheeling) ran his streak of double-figure scoring games to three with 10 points against



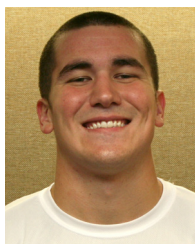

Knox. Stephani has averaged 13.3 points while shooting 57.7 percent from the floor. Stephani is now averaging 9.4 points per game this season while shooting 43.0 percent from the floor. Stephani has hit a team-best 38 3-pointers this season while shooting 43.2 percent from beyond the arc, which ranks ninth in the conference. Stephani is eighth in the league at 2.1 3-pointers per game.

►Junior guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, Ill./Glenbrook South) leads the Vikings in both scoring and rebounds. Nikitas ranks 12th in the conference in scoring at 14.3 points per game, and he is second in rebounding at 8.4 per contest.

►Just a few days after getting roughed up on the boards by Lake Forest, the Vikings rebounded (pun intended) nicely against Knox. Lawrence was a plus-13 on the glass against the Prairie Fire with a 38-25 rebounding edge. Lawrence is a minus-2.8 in rebounding margin for the season.

►The countdown to 1,000 continues for senior guard Ryan DePouw (Oconto, Wis./Oconto). He is just 45 points away from becoming the 22nd player in Lawrence history to

score 1,000. DePouw is averaging 12.6 points per game on the season.

►DePouw is tied with Nikitas for the team lead with 49 assists. DePouw is averaging 3.1 assists per game and Nikitas is at 2.9.

►Lawrence ranks sixth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 69.6 points per game, and the Vikings are fourth in scoring defense at 70.9 points per contest.

►Lawrence ranks second in the league in field goal percentage defense at 44.2 percent, and the Vikings are shooting 44.1 percent, which is ninth.

►Lawrence ranks seventh in the Midwest Conference in free-throw shooting at 70.0 percent.

►Lawrence ranks fifth in 3-point shooting at 36.2 percent, and the Vikings are sixth in defending the 3-pointer at 36.1 percent.

SCOUTING ST. NORBERT

▶St. Norbert is in the driver's seat when it comes to winning the conference championship. The Green Knights are three games ahead of second-place Monmouth with five games left to play. The Green Knights are gunning for their third consecutive title and fifth in the last six years.



▶The Green Knights jumped up five spots in the D3hoops.com poll this week to No. 9. The Green Knights have won eight consecutive games since a loss to John Carroll back on Dec. 30.

▶Forward Andrew Schwoerer and guard Austin Elliott pace the Green Knights in scoring. Schwoerer is fifth in the league at 17.2 points per game, and Elliott is 13th in the conference at 14.1. Schwoerer also is the top rebounder on the squad at 7.7 per game, and that ranks third in the conference. Elliott is the top assist man in the league at 4.9 per game.

▶The Green Knights have two players shooting better than 60 percent from the floor. Schwoerer is second in the league at 62.6 percent, and Steven Hofacker is fourth in the conference at 60.5 percent.

▶St. Norbert is the top defensive team in the league, allowing only 60.7 points per game. The Green Knights are scoring 79.2 points per game, and that ranks third in the conference. That translates into a league-best plus-18.6 scoring margin.

▶St. Norbert is shooting a league-best 55.2 percent from the floor. The Green Knights are also tops in field goal percentage defense at 38.4 percent.

▶The Green Knights are also the top 3-point shooting team in the conference at 43.7 percent. St. Norbert ranks first in defending the 3-pointer at 32.6

percent.

▶St. Norbert ranks second in the conference from the foul line at 74.4 percent.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS COLLEGE

▶The Blueboys have started to turn things around in recent weeks. Illinois College had lost 13 consecutive games before winning three of the last four. The Blueboys have notched wins over Knox, Carroll and at Cornell, sandwiched around a loss at Grinnell. The Blueboys host Beloit on Wednesday before traveling to Lawrence this weekend.



▶Three Illinois College players are averaging double figures in points. Cody Hildebrand is tops on the team at 11.7 points per game, and Brandon Fishburn is at 10.4 and Tim Schappaugh is at 10.2. Schappaugh also is averaging a team-best 2.4 assists per game.

▶Mitchell Patterson is tops on the team at 5.1 rebounds per game. The Blueboys are a minus-8.1 in rebounding margin.

▶Illinois College is scoring 67.7 points per game, and that ranks ninth in the Midwest Conference. The Blueboys are eighth in scoring defense at 77.8 points per contest.

▶The Blueboys are shooting a league-worst 40.6 percent from the floor. Illinois College is sixth in field goal percentage defense at 46.5 percent.

▶Illinois College is sixth in the league in free-throw shooting at 71.0 percent.

▶Illinois College is shooting 33.4 percent from 3-point range, and that is seventh in the conference. The Blueboys are third in the conference in defending the 3-pointer at 33.0 percent.

RIPON, Wis. — The Ripon College men's basketball team rallied late in the second half and went on to a 72-63 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University at the Storzer Center.

Justin Leistikow led Ripon with 21 points as he went 8-for-8 from the floor, including 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, and Kyle Loughrin added 19 points. Ripon's Ty Sabin, second in the nation in scoring at 29.3 points per game, was limited to 15 points and hit



only 4-of-13 shots from the floor.

Ryan DePouw paced Lawrence (5-10, 3-6) with 16 points, and Pete Winslow added 10 points as he connected on 3-of-4 shots from 3-point range. Mitch Willer had a perfect night as he added eight points on 3-for-3 shooting from the floor and 2-for-2 from the foul line.

Ripon had a 12-point advantage at 24-12 before Lawrence rallied in the first half. Lawrence went on a 15-2 run over the final 7:14 of the first half to take a 27-26 lead at the break. Winslow, Jeremy Stephani and Troy Miller had four points apiece over that stretch for the Vikings.
