#### THE COACHES

▶ Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his ninth season at Lawrence and has a record of 112-85 (.569).

▶ David Arseneault (Colby 1976) is in his 27th season at Grinnell and has a record of 349-263 (.570).

#### **THE SERIES**

In a series that dates back to 1940. Grinnell holds a 51-50 advantage. games vs. "the system."

#### **LAST GAME**

Lawrence swept its two games at the Puerto Rico Classic in Bayamon on Dec. 19-20.

In the first game, Lawrence limited Randoph to just 24 percent shooting in a 43-40 victory.

Jamie Nikitas led Lawrence and all scorers with 17 points and picked up eight rebounds. Jeremy Stephani added 13 points for the Vikings, and Ben Peterson grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds.

Josh Freund led Randolph, a school in Lynchburg, Va., with a double-double of 15 points and 14 rebounds.

Randolph shot just 15-of-62 (24.2 percent) from the floor for the game, and the Wild Cats hit 2-of-14 (14.2 percent) from 3-point range. Lawrence shot only 32.7 percent from the floor, including 24.1 percent from beyond the arc.

The game was tight throughout,

although Lawrence built the biggest lead by either team at 16-8 on Pete Winslow's layup midway through the first half. Lawrence was held to just two points for the rest of the first half, and the Wild Cats trimmed the margin to 18-17 at the break.

In a game that featured 10 lead changes and four ties, Randolph took its biggest lead of the game at 25-23 on a pair of Zach Desgain free throws. The teams then traded the lead before the Vikings grabbed the advantage for good at 35-33 on Nikitas' three-point play.

The Vikings built the advantage to five points after Stephani followed with a 3-pointer. Lawrence was unable to pull away, but the Vikings were up 43-38 after a Troy Miller free throw.

Freund's jumper cut the margin to 43-40, but the Wild Cats missed their final four shots from the floor, including a pair of 3-pointers in the final seconds that would have tied it.

Lawrence finished the trip to Puerto Rico with a 68-55 win over Bard on Dec. 20.

Nikitas posted a double-double with game highs of 26 points and 11 rebounds to lead Lawrence.

Stephani added 15 points, Mitch Willer had 10 and Peterson chipped in with eight for the Vikings.

DeVahnte Mosley paced Bard (3-6), a NCAA Division III school in New York, with 19 points.

Bard made the first basket of the game, but Lawrence hit a 3-pointer to grab a 3-2 lead and never trailed again. That was part of a 9-0 run as the Vikings built an early 9-2 edge.

Lawrence followed with a 19-11 outburst to push the lead to 28-13 late in the first half. Bard battled back to cut the margin to 35-24 at the break.

The Vikings held a double-digit advantage until the Raptors went on a scoring run to trim the lead to 41-33 at the 13-minute mark. Lawrence responded with an 11-2 run to take a 52-35 advantage. Nikitas scored six points during the outburst, which was capped by a Stephani 3-pointer.

▶Nikitas also leads the Vikinas in rebounding (7.1 per game), assists (3.6 per game) and steals (2.8 per game). Nikitas leads the Midwest Conference in steals and ranks ninth in assists.

Nikitas has been particularly strong inside the 3-point line. On field goal attempts from inside the arc, Nikitas is shooting 61.9 percent (73-for-118).

▶Sophomore guard Jeremy Stephani (Arlington Heights, III./Wheeling) leads the team with 23 3-pointers, but junior Pete Winslow (Evan-III./Evanston Jeremy Stephani ston. Township) is the top



3-point shooter at 40 percent (6-for-15).

Sophomore forward Ben Peterson (River Forest, III./Fenwick) posted his first double-digit scoring game of his career earlier this season with 10 points Ben Peterson against Lake Forest,



and he picked up his first double-digit rebounding game with 10 boards against Randolph. On the season, Peterson is 5.3 points and 4.2 rebounds per game.

neers are just short of that goal right now. Grinnell is second in the nation at 107.0 points per game, and Greenville is tops at 110.2.

- ▶Grinnell has six players averaging double figures in points, led by junior guard Julian Marx. Marx is at 20.6 points per game and is having a great season shooting the ball. He is at 47.6 percent from the floor, including 43.0 percent from beyond the arc. You don't want to foul Marx, who just doesn't miss. He is 25-for-26 from the foul line, which computes to 96.2 percent. That leads the Midwest Conference and is tied for fifth in all of NCAA Division III.
- ▶Grinnell ranks last in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense. The Pioneers are allowing 105.6 points per game.
- ▶Grinnell ranks sixth in the league in free-throw shooting at 70.5 percent. Take Marx's stunning numbers out of the mix, and the Pioneers are at 67.8

percent.

- ▶ Grinnell ranks seventh in the league in 3-point shooting at 33.6 percent. Grinnell is fourth in defending the 3-pointer at 31.1 percent.
- ▶Grinnell is shooting 40.1 percent from the floor, and that ranks 10th in the Midwest Conference. The Pioneers are last in the league in field goal percentage defense at 63.5 percent.
- ▶ Grinnell leads the conference in assists at 17.6 per game. Braedon Bayer is tops on the team at 3.2 per contest.
- ▶The Pioneers also lead the league in steals at 14.7 per game. Matt Jasaitis leads the team at 2.3 per game, and Bayer is second at 1.9.
- ▶Grinnell is a minus-11.1 in rebounding margin, and the Pioneers do not have a rebounder in the top 20 in the league. Grinnell's top rebounder is Nick Curta at 4.9 per game.

## November 14 Lawrence 74, Dominican (III.) 72

— Jamie Nikitas posted a double-double, and the Lawrence University men's basketball team edged

ketball team edged Dominican (III.) University 74-72 in a non-conference game.

Dominican missed a pair of shots, including a 3-pointer at the buzzer that would have won it, in the final six seconds.

Nikitas scored a game-high 23 points and pulled down a team-best 11 rebounds for the Vikings, who defeated Dominican in the season opener for the second consecutive year. Nikitas also added four assists and a pair of steals.

Jeremy Stephani added 17 points and hit five 3-pointers for the Vikings, and Mitch Willer had 15 points.

Tim Robertson scored 18 points and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds for the Stars.

Lawrence trailed 8-7 early, but the Vikings went on a 24-10 run to grab a 31-18 lead with 4:51 left in the first half. Stephani, Troy Miller, Pete Winslow and Connor Weas all hit 3-pointers during that stretch for the Vikings.

The Vikings would go on to lead 39-27 at the half, but Dominican quickly trimmed the margin to 43-40 early in the second half.

Dominican would take its biggest lead at 57-54, but the Vikings would take the lead back for good on Nikitas' layup with 7:46 left. It was a tight margin the rest of the way, and Lawrence led 70-66 on Nikitas' layup with 2:59 left.

Dominican scored the next four points to tie it at 70-70 with 58 seconds left, but Stephani buried a 3-pointer for a 73-70 lead with 38 ticks remaining.

The teams traded free throws, and Lawrence still led by two when Josh Mayberry missed a driving layup with six seconds left. Stephani grabbed the rebound but stepped out of bounds in the corner with 1.9 left. Quinn Pokora took the inbounds pass and fired a 3-pointer from the top of the key, and he missed as time expired.

## November 18 Wisconsin Lutheran 71 Lawrence 70

APPLETON, Wis. — The Lawrence University men's basketball team missed a



long 3-pointer in the final seconds, and Wisconsin Lutheran College hung on for a 71-70 non-conference victory at Alexander Gymnasium.

Jake Jarnigo and Tanner Schieve scored 15 points apiece and Jim Marose added 14 to pace the Warriors (1-1).

Lawrence looked like it might pull away early in the second half. Miller hit a 3-pointer less than a minute into the half to put the Vikings up 40-31.

The Vikings led by as many as 12 and went up 49-39 on Nikitas' jumper with 14:11 left. Wisconsin Lutheran then went on a 17-2 run over the next seven minutes to take a 56-51 lead with 7:21 left.

The Vikings immediately countered and got a three-point play from Willer to tie the game at 56-56. The Warriors pulled out to a 67-62 lead,

After Pete Winslow's three-point play gave the Vikings a 77-75 lead with 3:06 left in overtime, Sabin countered with a 3-pointer for a 78-77 advantage.

After the Vikings missed a 3-pointer, Ketz made a pair of free throws and Sabin followed with a layup as Ripon pulled away.

The Vikings trailed by 10 with six minutes left in regulation, but Lawrence went on a 12-1 run to take the lead.

Ben Peterson hit a jumper and Miller made a pair of free throws to start the rally. Jeremy Stephani and

Steve McAfee led Beloit (2-3, 1-2) with a double-double of 21 points and 11 rebounds.

Lawrence led by as many as 15 points early in the second half, but the Bucs whittled the lead down late at the foul line. Beloit hit five consecutive free throws to trim the margin to 67-64 with 2:24 remaining.

Josh Freund led Randolph, a school in Lynchburg, Va., with a double-double of 15 points and 14 rebounds.
