THE COACHES

▶ Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the

- 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his ninth season at Lawrence and has a record of 112-86 (.566).
- ▶Gary Grzesk (UW-Green Bay 1996) is in his 10th season at St. Norbert and has a record of 178-60 (.748). He is in his 13th season overall and has a record of 229-91 (.716).
- ▶Todd Skrivseth (Coe 1996) is in his fifth season at Monmouth and has a record of 42-61 (.408).

THE SERIES

▶In a series that goes all the way back to 1918, St. Norbert holds a 55-46 advantage. The Green Knights have won 12 straight in the series. Prior to that, Lawrence had won 10 straight and 13 of 14. Although Monmouth holds a 69-39 edge in the series with Lawrence that dates back to 1926, the Vikings have really cut into that deficit over the past decade-plus. Lawrence has an 18-4 record against Monmouth since the 2002-03 season, and the Vikings won 12 consecutive games over the Scots between 2007-08 and 2013-14.

LAST GAME

A scoring outburst midway through the second half Saturday put Grinnell ahead, and the Pioneers pulled away for a 109-89 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kyle Parker paced Grinnell with 23 points, and Julian Marx added 21.

Jamie Nikitas poured in 34 points, his fourth 30-plus point game of the season, to lead Lawrence. Nikitas went 12-of-17 from the floor and added six rebounds and a pair of steals.

Jeremy Stephani added 20 points for the Vikings, and Mitch Willer had 15 points on 6-for-7 shooting from the floor. Willer and Stephani added five assists apiece.

Lawrence's Pete Winslow added nine points and seven rebounds in the first half, but he didn't play in the second half due to injury.

Lawrence led by as many as nine points in the first half, and the Vikings held a 49-46 advantage at the half. The Vikings shot 61.3 percent (19-31) from the floor in the first half and held Grinnell's attack from beyond the arc to just 29 percent (9-31).

The Vikings broke the sixth tie of the game with layups from Willer and Nikitas to take a 73-69 advantage with 12:38 left in the game. Grinnell then scored the game's next 11 points, as Marx, Parker and Jacob Ekstrand all hit 3-pointers, to take an 80-73 lead with 10:16 left.

Nikitas stopped the run with a layup, but that's as close as Lawrence would get. Matt Jasaitis countered with a 3-pointer for Grinnell for an 83-75 edge. The Pioneers would push the lead to as many as 13 points in the next few minutes.

Lawrence did trim the lead 98-89 on Stephani's layup with 2:37 left, but Parker hit another 3-pointer for Grinnell. The Pioneers then went 8-for-8 from the foul line in the final 1:43 to seal the victory.

his 34-point performance against Grinnell. Nikitas moved past 1960s standouts Tom Steinmetz and Richard Schultz into 15th place on the career list with 1,101 Jamie Nikitas



points. Next up for Nikitas is Shawn Koerner (1,115) and John Dekker (1,117).

▶Nikitas posted his fourth 30-point game of the season this past Saturday with 34 against Grinnell. No player in recent history has topped the 30-point mark this many times in a season. The last player to do it more than once in a season was All-America guard Ryan Kroeger, who scored 32 vs. Knox and 30 vs. Monmouth back in the 2008-09 season. The last time Lawrence had four 30-point games in a season was during 2010-11 and four different players made up that group. Erik Borresen had 30 vs. St. Mary's (Md.), Conor Klusendorf scored 35 vs. Grinnell, Jon Mays posted 38 vs. Carroll and Tyler Crisman had 30 at Beloit.

Nikitas leads the Midwest Conference in scoring at 27.2 points per game. Nikitas also ranks fourth in all of NCAA Division III. Trey Bardsley of Nebraska Wesleyan leads the nation in scoring at 30.4 points per contest.

Nikitas also leads the Vikings in rebounding (7.0 per game), assists (3.3 per game) and steals (2.7 per game). Nikitas leads the Midwest Conference in steals, ranks eighth in rebounding and ninth in assists.

▶Sophomore guard Jeremy Stephani (Arlington Heights, III./Wheeling) leads the team with 27 3-pointers and his shooting percentage from beyond the Jeremy Stephani arc continues to im-



prove. Stephani is 7-for-16 (43.8 percent) from long range in his last two

games to improve to 31.4 percent on the season. Stephani is the only other player on the team averaging double figures in points at 12.7 per game. That ranks 20th in the Midwest Conference.

Lawrence ranks 11th in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 69.9 points per game. The Vikings are fifth in scoring defense at 71.5.

Lawrence is shooting 45.6 percent from the floor, good for sixth in the Midwest Conference. The Vikings are second in field goal percentage defense at 41.6 percent.

Lawrence is shooting 29.6 percent from 3-point range, and that ranks 10th in the Midwest Conference. The Vikings are seventh in defending the 3-pointer at 35.1 percent.

Lawrence is 11th in the league in free-throw shooting at 64.2 percent.

The Green Knights saw their eight-game win streak snapped on Dec. 30 with an 82-65 non-conference loss to Alma in the champion-ship game of the Nicolet



National Bank Holiday Tournament. Alma, which shot 55.6 percent for the game, is coached by former Lawrence assistant coach Sam Hargraves.

- St. Norbert is riding a 50-game win streak against Midwest Conference opponents. The Green Knights haven't lost to a league opponent Grinnell downed St. Norbert 104-99 back on Feb. 9, 2013.
- ▶St. Norbert's loss to Alma knocked the Green Knights out of the D3hoops. com Top 25. St. Norbert was No. 23 and are now first among the other teams receiving votes.
- St. Norbert's balanced attack has three players averaging double figures in points. Sophomore guard D.J. DeValk of Little Chute is tops on the squad at at 14.5 points per contest. Junior guard Ben Bobinski is next at 13.5 points per game, and junior guard Terrence Garner is at 11.3. Garner also is averaging a team-best 6.3 rebounds per contest.
- ▶The Green Knights are tops in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense at 65.2 points per contest. St. Norbert ranks fourth in scoring at 74.8 points per game.
- ▶St. Norbert is shooting 47.8 percent from the floor, good for second in the league. The Green Knights are fourth in field goal percentage defense at 42.2 percent.
- St. Norbert is shooting 36.3 percent from beyond the arc, and that rnks fourth in the conference. The green Knights are fifth in field goal percentage defense at 32.2 percent.

▶St. Norbert is fourth in the league in free-throw shooting at 74.1 percent.

- ▶The Scots have three players averaging double figures in points, led by Will Jones. He is at 16.6 points per game and is pulling down a teamhigh 8.5 rebounds per contest. Jones also leads the team in assists at 4.3 per game. Riley Blea is second at 15.1 points per game, and Jon Calhoun is next at 11.4.
- Monmouth is second in the league in scoring at 82.7 points per game. The Scots are ninth in scoring defense at 78.3 points per contest.
- Monmouth ranks third in the conference in shooting at 47.5 percent. The Scots are also third in field goal percentage defense at 42.0 percent.

— Jamie Nikitas posted a double-double, and the Lawrence University men's basketball team edged

ketball team edged Dominican (III.) University 74-72 in a non-conference game.

Dominican missed a pair of shots, including a 3-pointer at the buzzer that would have won it, in the final six seconds.

Nikitas scored a game-high 23 points and pulled down a team-best 11 rebounds for the Vikings, who defeated Dominican in the season opener for the second consecutive year. Nikitas also added four assists and a pair of steals.

Jeremy Stephani added 17 points and hit five 3-pointers for the Vikings, and Mitch Willer had 15 points.
