THE COACHES

▶ Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his ninth season at Lawrence and has a record of 110-84 (.567).

▶ Bob Semling (UW-Eau Claire 1981) is in his 11th season at UW-Stevens Point and has a record of 245-57 (.811).

Clay Nunley (Goucher 1998) is in his ninth season at Randolph and has a record of 111-105 (.514).

Adam Turner (Bard 2006) is in his seventh season at Bard and has a record of 32-123 (.206).

THE SERIES

▶In a series that dates all the way back to 1896, UW-Stevens Point holds a 32-13 advantage. The teams have met regularly since the 1997-98 season, including a pair of NCAA Division III Tournament games. The Pointers have won six straight, and Lawrence's last win was a 75-59 victory in the 2008-09 season.

LAST GAME

Lawrence's Jamie Nikitas poured in a career-high 35 points to lead the Vikings to a 77-67 Midwest Conference victory over Illinois College at Alexander Gymnasium on Dec. 5.

Nikitas also became the 23rd player in Lawrence history to score 1,000 career points. He entered the game needing 29 to reach 1,000 and now has 1,006 for his career. Nikitas hit 13-of-19 shots from the floor and went 4-for-7 from beyond the arc. He also had six rebounds and five assists.

Tim Schappaugh, who left the game with an injury, and Max Stutsman led Illinois College with 15 points apiece.

Eight other players scored for the Vikings with Pete Winslow leading that group with eight points and a team-best eight rebounds. Winslow also picked up five assists.

The Blueboys led 57-56 midway through the second half before Lawrence surged ahead. Lawrence went on a 13-2 run to grab a 69-58 lead with

Illinois College fought back and trimmed the lead back to 69-65 with seven consecutive points. Weas knocked down a jumper to stem the tide, the Vikings got a stop on the defensive end and Mitch Willer scored to put Lawrence up 73-65 with 4:00 left.

after Nikitas' layup with 1:13 left. The Blueboys were forced to foul and finally put the Vikings in the bonus with 28 seconds left. Nikitas, who topped his previous career high of 34 points that he matched at Beloit College just three days ago, made two free throws for the final margin.

VIKINGS UPDATE

Star guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, Ill./Glenbrook South) collected the second Midwest Conference Player of the Week award of his career after a pair of



stellar games in Lawrence victories. Nikitas, who also won the award last season, averaged 34.5 points while shooting 59.5 percent from the floor. He also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 3.0 steals per game. Nikitas scored 34 points, picked up three rebounds, two assists and six steals in Lawrence's 76-72 Midwest Conference win at Beloit on Dec. 2. He followed that with a career-high 35 points, six rebounds and five assists in a 77-67 conference victory over IIlinois College on Dec. 5.

Nikitas tied his career scoring high with 34 points against Beloit and then set a new career high with 35 against Illinois College.

Nikitas also passed the 1,000-point plateau and now ranks 22nd on the school's career scoring list with 1,006 points. Nikitas needs 23 points to pass former team- Jamie Nikitas mate Ryan DePouw



(1,028) for 21st place. Just ahead of DePouw are Jim Rasmussen (1,030) and Bob Townsend (1,031).

Nikitas is now averaging 29.5 points per game, which leads the Midwest Conference and ranks fourth in the nation. Kylan Anderson of Concordia Chicago is tops in the nation in scor-

SCOUTING UW-STEVENS POINT

There is no question that UW-Stevens Point is the best 3-3 team in the nation.



The Pointers have played a brutal non-conference schedule with three ranked opponents and St. Norbert in their first six games. The Pointers have lost two straight, both on the road. Stevens Point fell to No. 1 Augustana 81-58 and then dropped a 63-49 decision at North Central on Wednesday.

The two losses dropped UW-Stevens Point to No. 9 in the latest D3hoops. com Top 25.

The Pointers have two players averaging in double figures in points. Sean McGann is tops on the team in scoring at 14.7 points per game, and he leads the team in rebounding at 5.3 per contest. Stephen Pelkofer is at 13.7 points per game and has handed out a team-best 3.5 assists per contest.

The Pointers are shooting 42.6 percent from the floor, including 31.1 percent from beyond the arc. Stevens Point is connecting at 70.1 percent from the foul line.

Despite having a starting five featuring two 6-foot-7 players, the Pointers are a minus-6.5 in rebounding margin.

SCOUTING RANDOLPH

Randolph is a member of the Old Dominion Athletic Conference and is located in Lynch-



burg, Va., a city of 75,000 in the center of the state.

The WildCats are off to a 5-1 start to the season. Randolph has won two straight, including a 57-49 victory over Ferrum on Dec. 7. Randolph will play a pair of games at the Doc Greene Tournament at Juniata before heading to Puerto Rico.

Senior Zach Desgain is tops on the team in scoring at 13.5 points per game, and freshman Josh Freund is next at 12.0 points per game, and he leads the team at 7.0 rebounds per contest.

The WildCats are shooting 47.5 percent from the floor, including 31.8 percent from 3-point range. Randolph is shooting 68.3 percent on free throws.

SCOUTING BARD

▶Bard is off to a 3-3 start to the season and is coming off an 80-64 loss



at Medgar Evers on Thursday. Bard travels to Hamilton and then takes on Augsburg in Puerto Rico before facing the Vikings.

▶ Bard is a college with 2,000 students located in Annandale-on-Hudson, N.Y., about 100 miles north of New York City. Bard is one of 11 members of the Liberty League.

Emmanuel Rainey hasn't started a game this season, but he leads the Raptors in scoring at 13.3 points per game. DeVahnte Mosley is at 10.7 points per game and leads the team at 5.8 rebounds per contest.

Caleb LaRosa is also in double figures at 10.3 points per contest. LaRosa is the top 3-point shooter on the squad at 40.0 percent (12-30).

Dominican missed a pair of shots, including a 3-pointer at the buzzer that would have won it, in the final six seconds.

The Vikings would go on to lead 39-27 at the half, but Dominican quickly trimmed the margin to 43-40 early in the second half.


