THE SERIES

The teams met for the first time last season and Eureka holds a 1-0 advantage over the Vikings.

LAST MEETING

Eureka pulled away early in the second half and held on for a 61-52 nonconference victory over Lawrence on Dec. 17, 2012, at the Reagan Cen-

Jaylynn Stewart paced Eureka with a double-double of 21 points and 12 rebounds. Kelsey Shoemake also had a double-double for the Red Devils with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

Alex Deshler had a double-double for Lawrence with 19 points and 11 rebounds. Amber Lisowe had a team-high 20 points for the Vikings.

The Red Devils led by as many as 12 points in the first half, but Lawrence trimmed that margin to 34-28 at the half. Eureka opened the second half on a 7-0 run to build a 41-28 advantage. Kassidy Rinehart hit a pair of free throws at the 16:26 mark to get Lawrence's first points of the second half and cut the lead to 41-30.

Eureka would push the lead to as many as 15 points, but Lawrence did put together a late rally. Eureka led 55-40 with 8:11 left, but the Red Devils would score only six points the rest of the way.

Lisowe hit a 3-pointer and followed with a layup to trim the margin to 55-45 with 5:41 left. After Deshler scored on a layup to cut the lead to

58-49 with 3:07 left, the Vikings went cold. Lawrence missed its next three shots from the floor and committed a turnover in the next 2:22.

Lawrence also held Eureka scoreless during that stretch and finally sliced into the lead on a pair of Lisowe free throws with 45 seconds left to cut the lead to 58-51. After a missed free throw by Stewart, Deshler convered one of two free throws with 35 seconds left to trim the margin to 58-52.

Shoemake hit a jumper with 27 seconds left to seal the victory for the Red Devils.

LAST GAME

Lawrence scored a season-high 53 points in the second half on Feb. 16, 2013, but the Vikings couldn't reel in Grinnell, and the Pioneers hung on for a 79-68 Midwest Conference victory at Alexander Gymnasium.

In the season finale for both teams, Alissa Hirsh paced Grinnell with 21 points and five assists. Michelle Briggs had a double-double for Grinnell with 11 points and a gamehigh 10 rebounds.

Amber Lisowe led Lawrence with 19 points and a game-high six assists. Alex Deshler added 14 points, eight rebounds, four assists and two steals for the Vikings. Freshman Patsy Kealey chipped in with 13 points and pulled down a team-high nine rebounds for Lawrence.

Grinnell pulled away late in the first half, using a 7-0 run to stretch its lead to 25-10 with 3:18 left in the first half. The Pioneers led 28-15 at the break and used some hot shooting early in the second half to push the advantage to 47-24 with 16:00 left.

The Vikings were still down 19 at 64-45 with just under six minutes left, but Lawrence went on a 10-3 run to cut the margin to 67-55 with 3:19 left. Deshler had five points during that run and Lisowe buried a 3-pointer.

Grinnell recovered but Lawrence trimmed the lead to nine on two different occasions, both after 3-pointers by Lisowe and Deshler. Grinnell went 9-for-10 from the foul line in the final

VIKINGS UPDATE

▶Lawrence opens its season in the friendly confines of Alexander Gymnasium for the third consecutive season. The Vikings are 16-21



in season openers. Lawrence has not won a season-opening game since defeating Clarkson 73-45 to start the 2007-08 campaign.

▶Lawrence opens its season with four of its top five scorers back from a season ago. The Vikings were led last season by guard Amber Lisowe (Chilton, Wis./Fond du Lac Springs), who aver-

aged 13.9 points per game a season ago, which ranked fifth in the Midwest Conference. Lisowe also averaged 5.6 rebounds and team-high 2.5 assists per game.

▶Senior guard Alex Deshler (La Crosse, Wis./Aquinas) was second on the team in scoring last season at 10.5 points per game and pulled down a team-high Alex Deshler 6.6 rebounds per game. Deshler post-



ed five double-doubles last season.

Lawrence also returns its third-leading scorer, sophomore forward Patsy Kealey (New Rochelle, N.Y./Ursuline), who was at 7.0 points and 3.9 rebounds per game, and the fifth-leading scorer, sophomore forward Katie Schumacher (Little Chute, Wis./Little Chute), who averaged 5.2 points and 5.7 rebounds last season.

Lawrence embarks on a new era on Friday with rookie head coach Ashley Wellman. This is Wellman's first head coaching position. She is the 10th head coach in Lawrence women's basketball history.

Lawrence did a solid job defensively last season and allowed 70.3 points per game while opponents shot 41.2 percent from the floor. The Vikings struggled on the offensive end and averaged only 51.9 points per game. Lawrence shot 34.3 percent from the floor, including 26.9 percent from 3-point range.

SCOUTING EUREKA

▶ Eureka is coming off a good season that saw the Red Devils post a 16-9 overall record. Eureka finished second in the St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference with an 11-5 mark.



- ▶ Eureka was selected to finish second in the SLIAC again this season in a preseason poll of conference coaches.
- The Red Devils are led by senior forward Caty Eeten, who was a first-team all-conference selection last season. Eeten led the team and the SLIAC in scoring last season at 22.2 points per game. She did that while shooting a solid 42.4 percent from the floor, including an impressive 53.2 percent from 3-point range. Eeten also led the conference in 3-point shooting.
- ▶ Eeten was chosen as the SLIAC Player of the Week three times last season.
- The Red Devils also bring back two additional starters in forward Kelsey Shoemake and guard Jenna Brooks. Shoemake was second on the team last season at 13.3 points per game, and pulled down an impressive 9.8 rebounds per game. Brooks averaged 4.0 points and 2.5 rebounds per game

- ▶ Eureka also has experienced players back in forward Emily Camden and guard Amanda Schreck. Camden started six games last season and Schreck made 11 starts.
- ▶The Red Devils averaged 70.8 points per game a season ago and shot 40.2 percent from the floor. Led by Eeten, Eureka shot 31.6 percent from beyond the arc.
- ▶ Eureka allowed 61.3 points per game

- a season ago and opponents shot 34.8 percent from the floor. Opponents shot 25.2 percent from 3-point range against the Red Devils.
- ▶Eureka also begins a new era with first-year head coach Victoria Jones. Jones took over for Taren Martin, who resigned to become the associate head coach at NCAA Division I University of Alabama-Birmingham. Martin turned the program around and posted a 46-29 record in three seasons at the helm.
