LAST GAME

Ripon overcame a slow start and went on to a 55-34 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence this past Saturday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kacie Cullien went 4-for-9 from 3-point range and led Ripon with 14 points. Jill VanEperen went 2-for-10 from the floor but was a perfect 6-for-6 from the foul line to add 10 points for the Red Hawks.

Alex Deshler led Lawrence with a double-double of 13 points and 10 rebounds.

Lawrence went on an early 9-0 run, capped by Courtney Schmidt's 3-pointer, to grab a 9-2 lead with 13:15 left in the opening half.

Ripon then used the long ball to retake the lead. The Red Hawks got three 3-pointers from Cullen and treys from Abby Thelen and Chelsea Moldenhauer to put together a 20-2 run for a 22-11 lead.

Lawrence scored the last four points of the half but trailed 22-15 at the break. Ripon steadily built its advantage in the second half and would lead by as many as 23 points.

VIKINGS UPDATE

▶Lawrence is looking to break out of its three-game shooting slump. Over the past three games, dating back to Jan. 2, the Vikings are shooting



just 22 percent (35-for-159). Lawrence has hit just 15.6 percent (5-for-32) of its shots from 3-point range.

The Vikings do not have a player averaging double figures in points. Senior guard Alex Deshler Crosse, (La Wis./ Aquinas) leads the



team in scoring at Alex Deshler 9.7 points per game, which ranks 29th in the Midwest Conference.

Deshler is tops on the team in rebounding at 6.7 boards per game. She is the top rebounding guard in the league where she ranks seventh overall.

► After going 3-for-3 at the foul line against Ripon, Deshler now leads the Midwest Conference in free-throw shooting at 92.6 percent. Deshler has hit 25-of-27 attempts from the freethrow line this season. Knox's Chantal Heckman is second in the conference at 88.2 percent.

In case you're wondering, the season record for free-throw shooting is held by Lawrence Hall of Famer Sarah O'Neil, who converted 86.9 percent (53-for-61) of her free throws during the 1990-91 season.

Deshler picked up her third double-double in the last four games against Ripon with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Over the past four games, Deshler is averaging 10.5 points and 8.8 rebounds per game.
