### THE SERIES

►In a series that goes back to 1975, Ripon has a 48-28 lead over the Vikings. Ripon has won 13 consecutive games, and Lawrence hasn't won a game in the series since sweeping the season series in 2006-07.

►Lawrence holds a 19-13 lead over Knox in the series that stretches back to 1989. Lawrence won the earlier

matchup this season with a dramatic 93-92 comeback victory at Knox.

### LAST GAME

Grinnell held off a late run by Lawrence and posted a 62-48 Midwest Conference victory this past Saturday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Alissa Hirsh led Grinnell and all scorers with 20 points. Abby Jaeger added 15 points for the Pioneers and Anne Boldt had 11. Both Jaeger and Boldt had a team-high nine rebounds.

Alex Deshler posted a double-double for Lawrence with 14 points and a game-high 14 rebounds.

Lawrence trailed 31-42 with 8:40 remaining, but the Vikings edged closer over the next few minutes. Andrea Wilkinson had a putback layup, and Courtney Schmidt followed with a pair of free throws to trim Grinnell's lead to 42-35.

After a Grinnell turnover, Katie Schumacher's layup off a pass from Patsy Kealey cut the margin to 42-37 with 5:43 left. That's as close as the Vikings would get as Hirsh took the game over the next minute.

Hirsh hit a jumper and then got a three-point play after a Lawrence turnover to push the lead back to 47-37 with 4:45 left. The Vikings got as close as eight points twice, the last time on Deshler's reverse layup with 1:25 left, but could get no closer.

### VIKINGS UPDATE

▶It is starting to sound like a broken record, but Lawrence continues to be ice cold shooting the basketball. Over the past five games, Lawrence is shooting just 22.7 percent from the floor, including 15 percent on 3-pointers.

▶Senior guard Alex Deshler (La Crosse, Wis./Aquinas) set a career high with 14 rebounds against

Grinnell this past Saturday. Deshler had pulled down 13 rebounds in three games during her career, including earlier this season against Finlandia.

▶Deshler posted a double-double against Grinnell, and that is her fourth double-double of the season and her fourth in the last six games.

▶Deshler is the leading scorer on the team at 10.2 points per contest. She also ranks fifth in the Midwest Conference in rebounding at 7.3 per game and is the top rebounding guard in the league.

▶Deshler now has 788 points for her

career, just 12 points away from passing Laura Aerts (799) for 16th place on the Lawrence career scoring list.

▶Deshler continues to lead the Midwest Conference in free-throw shooting. Deshler is at 87.5 percent after going 35-for-40 at the line this season.

▶The Vikings were dominant on the glass against Grinnell this past Saturday. Lawrence enjoyed a 54-39 rebounding edge, and this marks the sixth time this season Lawrence has been at least a plus-13 in rebounding margin. On the season, Lawrence is a plus-4.4 in rebounding margin.

▶Sophomore forward Patsy Kealey (New Rochelle, N.Y./Ursuline) matched her career high with four assists against Grinnell. Kealey also had four assists in two other games this season. On the season, Kealey is averaging 6.6 points, 4.9 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game.

▶Lawrence is sixth in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense at 67.2 points per game. The Vikings are 11th in the conference in scoring offense at 55.1 points per game.

▶Lawrence is 11th in the league in field goal percentage at 32.9 percent. The Vikings rank fourth in field goal percentage defense at 38.4 percent.

▶Lawrence is 11th in 3-point shooting at 22.1 percent, and Lawrence is seventh in defending the 3-pointer at 27.5 percent.

### SCOUTING RIPON

▶Ripon fell 55-45 to Cornell this past Saturday. Cornell's superb center, Taylor Dicus, led the Rams to the win with a double-double of 17 points and 12 re-



bounds. Sia Gonyo paced Ripon with 15 points. The bigger Rams pounded Ripon on the glass with a 41-28 rebounding edge. Ripon trailed by 19 with less than five minutes left but put on a late surge to close to the final margin of 10 points.

►Forward Jill VanEperen leads Ripon in scoring at 16.0 points per game and ranks fifth in the conference in scoring. Guard Kacie Cullen also is in double figures at 11.0 points per game, and Nicole Herkert is at 9.9.

►Ripon also gets the bulk of its rebounding from those three players. Herkert is tops on the team at 5.5 rebounds per game, VanEperen is at 5.3 and Cullen is at 5.1.

►VanEperen also is tops on the team at 3.8 assists per game.

►Ripon is ninth in the league in scoring offense at 63.2 points per game, and the Red Hawks are third in scoring defense at 65.1.

►Ripon is shooting 39.9 percent, which ranks eighth in the conference. Ripon is fifth in field goal percentage defense at 39.1 percent.

►Ripon is second in the league in 3-point shooting at 30.2 percent. Ripon ranks second in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 24.3 percent.

### SCOUTING KNOX

►Emily DeNoyer poured in 25 points and Malory Christenson and Breann Maryanski had 18 points apiece to lead Carroll to a 92-78 win at Knox this past Saturday. Jodi Marver paced the Prairie Fire with 19 points.

►Guard Jodi Marver leads the team in scoring and ranks seventh in the league at 15.2 points per game. Jessica Howard also is in double digits at 12.8 points per game.

## 2013-14 GAME RECAPS

**November 16**

**Eureka 51, Lawrence 48**

APPLETON, Wis.

— The Lawrence University women's basketball team missed a game-tying 3-pointer at the buzzer, and Eureka College hung on for a 51-48 nonconference victory in the season opener at Alexander Gymnasium.



Kelsey Shoemake posted a double-double for Eureka (1-0) with 15 points and 11 rebounds.

Andrea Wilkinson had her first career double-double for the Vikings (0-1) with 10 points and 12 rebounds. Kanae Nishitani led Lawrence and all scorers with 17 points and also picked up a team-high three steals.

Eureka led by as many as seven points in the first half, but the Vikings rallied early in the second half to tie the game at 25-25. The teams swapped the lead, and Lawrence took its final lead at 41-40 on Katie Schumacher's layup with 4:54 left.

The Red Devils led by three at 46-43 when Nishitani was whistled for a foul against Caty Eeten. Eeten missed both free throws, but Lawrence was called for another foul boxing out Eeten. Given another chance, she made both free throws to give the Red Devils a 48-43 lead with 56 seconds left.

Nishitani drove to the basket, scored and was fouled. She converted the three-point play to cut the margin to 48-46. After Jenna Brooks converted 1 of 2 free throws, Patsy Kealey hit a driving layup to cut the margin to 49-48 with 28 seconds left.

Brooks was fouled again and converted both free throws with eight seconds left to put the Red Devils up 51-48. The Vikings broke the Eureka press and found an open Alex Deshler in the corner, but her 3-pointer was off the mark at the buzzer.

**Lawrence 78, Mount Mary 44**

Wis. — The Lawrence University women's basketball team played a strong second half and cruised to a 78-44 nonconference victory over Mount Mary University at the Bloechl Center.



Kassidy Rinehart had a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds to lead Lawrence (1-1). Rinehart also had six assists and six steals. Freshman guard Kanae Nishitani had a double-double with 10 points and 10 assists, which was just two shy of tying the Lawrence game record.

It also was the first coaching victory for Lawrence coach Ashley Wellman, who is in her rookie season with the Vikings.

Katie Schumacher and Alex Deshler added 13 points apiece for the Vikings.

Taylor Baumgart scored 18 points and Ashley Leverenz added 14 points to pace Mount Mary (0-3).

Lawrence led 12-10 midway through the first half when the Vikings scored seven consecutive points, capped by a Rinehart free throw, to take a 19-10 edge with 7:35 left.

The Vikings would go on to lead 30-23 at the break, but Mount Mary scored the first six points of the second half to cut the lead to 30-29 at the 18:41 mark.

Lawrence led 34-33 when the Vikings went on a 17-6 run to take command. Rinehart scored six points and Andrea Wilkinson had five during the run that gave Lawrence a 51-39 lead with 10:06 left.
