THE SERIES

Lawrence holds a 7-3 edge in the series, which began in the 1988-89 season.

Lawrence has an 18-13 leads in the series, which dates to the 1989-90 season.

Lawrence increased its lead in the series against Illinois College to 18-14 with a victory late last season. The teams met for the first time in the 1991-92 season.

LAST GAME

Lawrence streaked to a big early lead and rolled to an 80-29 nonconference victory over Mount Mary at Alexander Gymnasium on Dec. 5.

Alex Deshler paced four Lawrence players in double figures with 13 points, and she added six rebounds, four steals and three assists.

Kassidy Rinehart and Andrea Wilkinson had 11 points apiece for the Vikings, and Wilkinson pulled down a team-high eight rebounds. Patsy Kealey came off the bench to score 10 points for Lawrence.

Emily Barker paced Mount Mary with 13 points, and Ashley Leverenz had a game-high nine rebounds.

Lawrence scored the first five points of the game and never looked back. The Vikings led by double digits at 16-5 on Jeannine Schulz's layup with 9:27 left in the first half.

Lawrence went on a 19-0 run over a span of 6:47 to expand the lead from 12-5 to 31-5 with 3:43 left in the first half. Deshler scored six points during the outburst and Wilkinson, Schulz and Katie Schumacher had four points apiece.

The Vikings forced 17 Mount Mary turnovers in the first half, and held the Blue Angels to just 13.6 percent shooting (3-for-22) before the break. Mount Mary didn't get to double fig-

ures on the scoreboard until 1:26 was left in the opening half.

Lawrence then scored the first 13 points of the second half to build a 52-11 lead with 16:02 left. The Vikings would lead by as many as 53 points.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence posted one of its biggest wins in recent memory with a 51-point victory over Mount Mary on Dec. 5.



The 29 points is the lowest total scored by a Lawrence opponent since Grinnell was held to 22 points in a 44-point blowout by the Vikings back on Feb. 1, 2002.

Lawrence shot 47.3 percent (35-74) from the floor against Mount Mary, and that is the Vikings' best shooting performance in several seasons. It's the highest shooting percentage for Lawrence since the Vikings hit on 48.9 percent (23-47) of their shots at Carroll on Jan. 11, 2011.

Lawrence also committed a seasonlow 14 turnovers against the Blue Angels. That's the lowest turnover total for Lawrence since the Vikings had just 11 turnovers vs. Finlandia on Jan. 3,2013.

▶Freshman guard Kanae Nishitani (Kanagawa, Japan/ Yamate Gakuin) leads the Vikings in scoring at 11.8 points per game and that ranks 15th Kanae Nishitani in the Midwest Con-

ference.



also ranks second in the league at 2.8 steals per game and fourth at 4.5 assists per contest.

Nishitani

Senior guard Alex Deshler (La Crosse, Wis./Aquinas) put together a very efficient game against Mount Mary. In just 22 minutes, Deshler scored a game-high 13 points on 5-for-8

shooting, including 2-for-2 from 3-point range. She also picked up six rebounds, four steals and three assists. Deshler is now scoring at 9.5 points per game, which is tied for second on the team.

Lawrence is first in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense at 47.0 points per game. The Vikings are 10th in the conference in scoring offense at 62.0 points per game.

Lawrence is ninth in the league in field goal percentage at 38.6 percent. The Vikings rank first in field goal percentage defense at 31.2 percent.

Lawrence is eighth in 3-point shooting at 23.4 percent, and Lawrence is first in defending the 3-pointer at 13.0 percent. Teams have hit just 6-of-46 3-pointers against Lawrence this season.

SCOUTING CORNELL

▶Cornell rallied from a five-point halftime deficit and went on to a 92-74 Midwest Conference win over Knox this past Saturday. The



Rams scored 57 points in the second half and enjoyed a 65-30 rebounding edge for the game.

▶Cornell is just out of this week's D3hoops.com Top 25. The Rams check in at No. 28.

▶ Junior center Taylor Dicus was named the Midwest Conference player of the Week after a monster game against Knox. She broke school game records with 39 points and 26 rebounds. Dicus broke the school's single-game scoring mark of 37 points, set by Sarah Larkin against Knox in 1996. Dicus established a new record for made field goals, which was previously 15 and shared by Colene McElmeel (vs. Iowa Wesleyan, 1989) and Katie Haviland (vs. Loras, 1982). Dicus also took down a long-standing program record for most rebounds in a game. Sheryl Gatewood held the mark of 23 rebounds, set against Monmouth in 1983.

Dicus leads Knox in scoring and rebounding and is averaging a doubledouble. She is averaging 19.0 points per game and 13.5 rebounds per contest. Dicus is shooting a stellar 60.4 percent from the floor.

With their size up front, the Rams have been dominant on the glass. Cornell, which has three players at 6-foot-0 or taller, is at plus-12.8 in rebounding margin (50.0-37.2).

Cornell is second in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 79.8 points per game. The Rams are fifth in scoring defense at 60.8 points per contest.

The Rams are fourth in the conference field goal percentage at 41.2 percent. Cornell ranks third in field goal percentage defense at 32.3 percent.

Cornell is shooting 31.9 percent from 3-point range and that ranks second in the conference. The Rams are also second in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 20.8 percent.

SCOUTING KNOX

Knox is looking to bounce back after a 102-83 loss to rival Mon- Prairie Fire mouth on Tues-



day night. Marla Willard led six Monmouth players in double figures with 17 points. Chantal Heckman paced the Prairie Fire with 20 points.

Jessica Howard leads Knox in scoring at 13.7 points per game, which places her ninth in the Midwest Conference. She is the only Knox player averaging double figures in points.

Howard is tops in the league at 2.8 3-pointers per game. She also ranks seventh at 2.3 steals per game.

Jamie Blue is tops on the squad in rebounding at 5.2 per contest.

With its uptempo style, Knox is leading the league in scoring offense at 85.2 points per game. The Prairie Fire also is last in the league in scoring defense at 107.8 points per game.

Knox is shooting just 32.2 percent from the floor, and that ranks 10th in the league. Knox is last in the conference in field goal percentage defense at 52.2 percent.

The Prairie Fire is shooting 21.3 per-

cent on 3-pointers, which ranks 10th in the conference. Knox is fifth in 3-point defense at 26.0 percent.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS COLLEGE

▶Illinois College topped Millikin 56-51 on Tuesday night in a nonconference tilt. Hannah McGinnis scored 21 points and Brittney Burgess



added 19 to lead Illinois College to the win.

The Lady Blues have a new coach Lora Westling, who also is a newcomer to the Midwest Conference. Westling takes over for Brenna Kelly, who retired after 26 seasons and 316 victories at Illinois College.

Hannah McGinnis is the top scorer in the Midwest Conference at 20.6 points per game. Brittney Burgess also is in double figures at 15.4 points per contest, and that ranks fourth in the conference.

McGinnis also is the top rebounder in the conference at 14.9 rebounds per game.

Illinois College ranks sixth in the conference in scoring offense at 69.3 points per game. The Lady Blues are seventh in scoring defense at 70.6 points per game.

Illinois College is shooting 39.6 percent from the floor, which ranks seventh in the league. IC is seventh in field goal percentage defense at 40.3 percent.

The Lady Blues are shooting 29.4 percent from beyond the arc, which is good for fifth place in the league. Teams are hitting at 29.0 percent from 3-point range, and that ranks ninth in the conference.

2013-14 GAME RECAPS

November 16 Eureka 51, Lawrence 48

APPLETON, Wis. - The Lawrence University women's basketball team missed a game-tying 3-pointer at the buzzer, and Eureka College hung on for a 51-48 noncon-

ference victory in the season opener at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kelsey Shoemake posted a double-double for Eureka (1-0) with 15 points and 11 rebounds.

Andrea Wilkinson had her first career double-double for the Vikings (0-1) with 10 points and 12 rebounds. Kanae Nishitani led Lawrence and all scorers with 17 points and also picked up a team-high three steals.

Eureka led by as many as seven points in the first half, but the Vikings rallied early in the second half to tie the game at 25-25. The teams swapped the lead, and Lawrence took its final lead at 41-40 on Katie Schumacher's layup with 4:54 left.

The Red Devils led by three at 46-43 when Nishitani was whistled for a foul against Caty Eeten. Eeten missed both free throws, but Lawrence was called for another foul boxing out Eeten. Given another chance, she made both free throws to give the Red Devils a 48-43 lead with 56 seconds left.

Nishitani drove to the basket, scored and was fouled. She converted the three-point play to cut the margin to 48-46. After Jenna Brooks converted 1 of 2 free throws, Patsy Kealey hit a driving layup to cut the margin to 49-48 with 28 seconds left.

Brooks was fouled again and converted both free throws with eight seconds left to put the Red Devils up 51-48. The Vikings broke the Eureka press and found an open Alex Deshler in the corner, but her 3-pointer was off the mark at the buzzer.

November 22 Lawrence 78, Mount Mary 44

MILWAUKEE, Wis. — The Lawrence University women's basketball team played



a strong second half and cruised to a 78-44 nonconference victory over Mount Mary University at the Bloechl Center.

Kassidy Rinehart had a doubledouble with 20 points and 10 rebounds to lead Lawrence (1-1). Rinehart also had six assists and six steals. Freshman guard Kanae Nishitani had a double-double with 10 points and 10 assists, which was just two shy of tying the Lawrence game record.

It also was the first coaching victory for Lawrence coach Ashley Wellman, who is in her rookie season with the Vikings.

Katie Schumacher and Alex Deshler added 13 points apiece for the Vikings.

Taylor Baumgart scored 18 points and Ashley Leverenz added 14 points to pace Mount Mary (0-3).

Lawrence led 12-10 midway through the first half when the Vikings scored seven consecutive points, capped by a Rinehart free throw, to take a 19-10 edge with 7:35 left.

The Vikings would go on to lead 30-23 at the break, but Mount Mary scored the first six points of the second half to cut the lead to 30-29 at the 18:41 mark

Lawrence led 34-33 when the Vikings went on a 17-6 run to take command. Rinehart scored six points and Andrea Wilkinson had five during the run that gave Lawrence a 51-39 lead with 10:06 left.

The Vikings then went on a 23-2 run to finish the game as Lawrence held the Blue Angels without a field goal over the final 7:48.

Lawrence held Mount Mary to just 25.9 percent shooting (7-27) in the second half while the Vikings shot 50 percent (19-38) from the floor after the break.

December 4 Carroll 64, Lawrence 42

APPLETON, Wis. The Carroll University women's basketball team opened the second half with a 13-0 run and went on CARROLL UNIT to a 64-42 Midwest



Conference victory over Lawrence University at Alexander Gymnasium.

Breann Maryanski paced Carroll (4-1, 2-0 MWC) with 17 points and seven rebounds. Kanae Nishitani led Lawrence (1-2, 0-1) with 11 points and four steals, and Katie Schumacher added nine points and a game-high seven rebounds.

The Pioneers led 29-21 at the half, and Malory Christenson opened the second half by hitting her only 3-point attempt of the game. Carroll hit its first five shots from the floor in the second half, capped by Christenson's layup, to take a 42-21 lead with 17:14 left.

Nishitani finally stopped the run by hitting her only 3-pointer of game at the 16:54 mark. Carroll would go on to lead by as many as 22 points, and the Vikings never got closer than 17 the rest of the way.

Lawrence was strong for nearly all of the first half, and the Vikings tied the game for the eighth time at 20-20 when Kassidy Rinehart hit a jumper with 4:21 left. Carroll then finished the opening half on an 8-1 run to lead 29-21 at the break.

Lawrence committed a seasonworst 27 turnovers and hit on only 11 of 38 shots (28.9 percent) from the floor.

Lawrence scored the first five points of the game and never looked back. The Vikings led by double digits at 16-5 on Jeannine Schulz's layup with 9:27 left in the first half.

Lawrence went on a 19-0 run over a span of 6:47 to expand the lead from 12-5 to 31-5 with 3:43 left in the first half. Deshler scored six points during the outburst and Wilkinson, Schulz and Katie Schumacher had four points apiece.

The Vikings forced 17 Mount Mary turnovers in the first half, and held the Blue Angels to just 13.6 percent shooting (3-for-22) before the break. Mount Mary didn't get to double figures on the scoreboard until 1:26 was left in the opening half.
