## THE COACHES

Ashley Wellman (Alma 2008) is in her first season at Lawrence. Mark Heidorf (UW-Oshkosh 1998) is in his first season at Mount Mary. Heidorf is in his fifth sea-

## THE SERIES

Lawrence holds a 10-1 lead in the series with the Blue Angels. The teams met for the first time in the 1976-77 season and last played in 2009-10 campaign. Lawrence has won the last two games with Mount Mary.

## LAST MEETING

This was the latest home opener in Lawrence women's basketball history, but it turned out to be worth the wait for the Vikings.

Lawrence rolled to an 89-36 non-
conference victory over Mount Mary College on Jan. 5, 2010, at Alexander Gymnasium.

Laura Aerts matched her career high with 21 points to pace Lawrence, which now has a modest two-game win streak. Aerts also had a careerhigh nine steals, which was one short of the school's game record. Aerts finished with seven rebounds and seven assists.

Katie Condon came off the bench to score 15 points for the Vikings. Kanesha Walker picked up a doubledouble with career highs of 14 points and 11 rebounds. Sam Nimmer scored a career-high 13 points, and Becca Anderson also had a career high with 10 points.

Jordan Osley led Mount Mary with 14 points, and Mary Holmberg added 10 points. Nunciata Gardner pulled down a game-high 14 rebounds for the Blue Angels.

Lawrence jumped on the Blue Angels early, going on a $15-0$ run to take a 22-4 lead with 11:36 left in the first half. After a free throw broke a 5:31 scoreless drought for Mount Mary,

Lawrence went on a 13-2 run and led 35-7 with 7:30 left in the opening half. The Vikings would lead 50-16 at the half, with Aerts scoring 17 points in the opening 20 minutes.

Mount Mary, which committed 34 turnovers, never got closer than 30 points early in the second half, and the Vikings had expanded their lead to 49 at the 11:56 mark of the second half. The 53 -point final margin was Lawrence's largest lead of the game.

The 53-point win is Lawrence's largest margin of victory since the Vikings beat Finlandia University by 49 (98-49) on Dec. 12, 2005. The 36 points matches the fewest scored by a Lawrence opponent in recent memory. The Vikings held Beloit College to 36 points in a victory on Feb. 8, 2006.

## LAST GAME

Lawrence missed a game-tying 3 -pointer at the buzzer, and Eureka hung on for a 51-48 nonconference victory in the season opener last SAturday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kelsey Shoemake posted a dou-ble-double for Eureka with 15 points and 11 rebounds.

Andrea Wilkinson had her first career double-double for the Vikings with 10 points and 12 rebounds. Kanae Nishitani led Lawrence and all scorers with 17 points and also picked up a team-high three steals.

Eureka led by as many as seven points in the first half, but the Vikings rallied early in the second half to tie the game at 25-25. The teams swapped the lead, and Lawrence took its final lead at 41-40 on Katie Schumacher's layup with 4:54 left.

The Red Devils led by three at 4643 when Nishitani was whistled for a foul against Caty Eeten. Eeten missed both free throws, but Lawrence was called for another foul boxing out Eeten. Given another chance, she made both free throws to give the Red Devils a $48-43$ lead with 56 seconds left.

## VIKINGS UPDATE

-With the loss to Eureka, Lawrence is 16 22 in season openers. Lawrence has not won a seasonopening game since defeating Clarkson
 73-45 to start the 2007-08 campaign.
-Lawrence got a solid debut from freshman guard Kanae Nishitani (Kanagawa, Japan/Yamate Gakuin). Nishitani, a student attending Lawrence as part
 of a study abroad partnership with Waseda University, scored 17 points, grabbed four rebounds, had three steals and one assist.
-Sophomore forward Andrea Wilkinson (Racine, Wis./ Lutheran) jumped right from volleyball season into basketball. With less than two weeks of prac-


Andrea Wilkinson tice under her belt, Wilkinson went out and turned in her first career doubledouble in the season opener. Wilkinson scored 10 points and grabbed 12 rebounds against Eureka. Those were both career highs for Wilkinson, who surpassed her previous bests of seven points at Illinois College last season and seven rebounds at home vs. Beloit last season. Wilkinson played in all but one match during the recent volleyball season and averaged 1.08 kills per set.
-Lawrence played without senior guard Amber Lisowe (Chilton, Wis./ Fond du Lac Springs) in the opener due to injury. Lisowe averaged a team-high 13.9 points per game a season ago.

TTurnovers have been a huge problem for the Vikings over the past two seasons, but Lawrence did a better job handling the ball in the season opener. Lawrence had 19 turnovers against Eureka, and while that isn't ideal, it is better than the 25.1 turnovers per game the team averaged last season. Lawrence had just five games last season in which it had fewer than 20 turnovers.

Another bright spot in the opener was the job the Vikings did on the glass. Lawrence outrebounded the Eureka 53-44 and gave up just nine offensive rebounds. Lawrence grabbed 18 caroms on the offensive end and converted that into 14 second-chance points.

Eureka really won the game at the foul line this past Saturday. The Red Devils went 14 -for- 23 from the stripe, while Lawrence shot just 10 free throws and made seven.

## SCOUTING MOUNT MARY

Mount Mary is looking for its first victory after a rough 104-36 loss at Wisconsin Lutheran on Tuesday night. Emily Barker led Mount Mary with 12 points, and five players scored in double figures for Wisconsin Lutheran. The Warriors scored the game's first 10 points and bolted to a 51-12 lead at the half.

Mount Mary is coached by first-year mentor Marc Heidorf. He should be a familiar face to Lawrence fans. Heidorf

coached at Lawrence for the 200809 and 2009-10 seasons. He finished with a record of 3-43 with the Vikings before heading out to coach at the University of Maine-Presque Isle. Heidorf put together a 16-27 record at Presque Isle. Heidorf also serves as the director of athletics at Mount Mary.

Through the first two games, guard Emily Barker leads the Blue Angels in scoring at 15.5 points per game. Barker also is tops in rebounding at 6.5 per game.

Porward Taylor Baumgart also is
in double figures in scoring at 12.5 points per contest. Tied for tops in rebounding is the tallest player, 6 -foot2 Ashley Leverenz, who is at 6.5 rebounds and 8.5 points per contest.

- Mount Mary is a NCAA Division III institution, but the Blue Angels are currently a school without a conference. Mount Mary competes as an independent.
- Mount Mary is an all women's school and sponsors only six intercollegiate sports, basketball, tennis, volleyball, soccer, cross country and softball.
