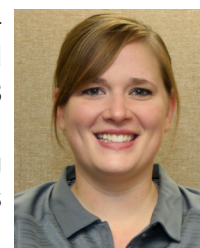

### LAST GAME

Lawrence scored just one point over the final 11 minutes and endured a horrendous afternoon at the foul line in a 41-40 Midwest Conference loss to Ripon at Alexander Gymnasium on Nov. 22.

Ripon got two free throws from Meg Ryan with 30 seconds left to take the lead, and freshman guard Lauren Deveikis missed a jumper with five seconds left that would have won it for Lawrence.

Both teams had a rough time at the foul line as Lawrence connected on only 9-of-22 from the stripe and Ripon hit just 9-of-21.

Freshman Danelle Buck led Lawrence with 11 points and she picked up seven rebounds. Freshman forward Elizabeth Arco pulled down 10 rebounds and added eight points for the Vikings. Andrea Wilkinson chipped in with nine points for the Vikings.

Ryan, McKenzie Banasik and Nicole Herkert scored 10 points apiece to pace Ripon, and Herkert had a game-high 13 rebounds.

Lawrence led throughout most of the contest as the Vikings took their first lead at 7-5 on Arco's three-point play with 13:15 left in the first half. Lawrence would build that advantage to as much as nine points before the Red Hawks trimmed the lead to 28-22 at the half.

The Vikings grabbed their biggest lead of the game by going on a 6-0 run, capped by Natalie Kramer's layup and an Arco free throw with 11:07 left, for a 39-27 edge.

Ripon began chipping away at the advantage as the Vikings went ice cold from the floor and the foul line. Lawrence finished the game by going 0-for-11 from the floor and 1-for-5 from the line.

Lawrence's only points in that stretch came on Kassidy Rinehart's free throw with 4:51 remaining that gave the Vikings a 40-35 lead. Ripon got a layup from Chelsea Moldenhau-

er and a couple of free throws from Banasik to cut the lead to 40-39.

The Vikings then committed three consecutive turnovers before fouling Ryan. She hit both free throws to give Ripon the lead for good.

### VIKINGS UPDATE

▶Lawrence has not played in 10 days since facing Ripon on Nov. 22. The Vikings took the week of Thanksgiving off due to final exams as the



first term ended for the school. The Vikings have a six-week break from the classroom and do not return to school until the winter term begins after Jan. 1.

▶Lawrence got a glimpse of the future in the game against Ripon as a pair of first-year players were the leading scorer and rebounder. Forward Danelle Buck (Newton, Wis./Valders) scored a season-high 11 points and grabbed a season-best seven rebounds. Forward Elizabeth Arco (Bartlett, Ill./Bartlett) grabbed a season-

high 10 rebounds and added eight points and three blocks.  
▶Lawrence boosted its 3-point shooting output by a factor of three in the game against Ripon. Heading into the third game of the season, Lawrence had made just one 3-pointer, by Buck in the season opener at Concordia Chicago. Lawrence went 3-for-5 from beyond the arc against the Red Hawks with Buck, Natalie Kramer (Mendota Heights, Minn./Henry Sibley) and Lauren Deveikis (Naperville, Ill./Neuqua Valley) all connecting from long distance.

▶Lawrence ranks last in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 45.0 points per game. The Vikings are a solid fifth in the league in scoring defense at 65.7 points per contest.

▶The Vikings are seventh in the conference in field goal percentage at 38.0 percent. Lawrence is third in field goal percentage defense at 39.3 percent.

▶Because of the limited number of

attempts, Lawrence ranks first in the conference in 3-point shooting at 40 percent (4-10). The Vikings are seventh in field goal percentage defense at 32.5 percent.

### SCOUTING BELOIT

▶Carroll rallied from a nine-point halftime deficit to beat visiting Beloit 61-51 on Nov.



25. Lana Wieseman scored 16 points and pulled down eight rebounds for the Bucs, who turned the ball over 29 times.

▶Lana Wieseman leads the Midwest Conference in scoring at 22.4 points per contest. Nora Polaski is tops on the team in rebounding at 7.2 per game.

▶Kelsey Horvath and Laura Panicali are the team leaders in assists at 2.8 and 2.6 per game, respectively.

▶Beloit ranks fourth in the league in scoring offense at 65.6 points per game. The Bucs are ninth in scoring defense at 74.4 points per game.

▶Beloit is tops in the league in shooting at 44.6 percent. The Bucs are eighth in field goal percentage defense at 42.1 percent.

▶Beloit ranks 10th in the league in 3-point shooting at 25.0 percent. The Bucs are third in defending the 3-pointer at 25.9 percent.

### November 15

#### Concordia Chicago 95, Lawrence 57

RIVER FOREST, Ill. — The Concordia University Chicago women's basketball team got



off to a fast start and rolled to a 95-57 nonconference victory over Lawrence University at Geiseman Gymnasium.

Lauren Orr scored a game-high 20 points off the bench to pace the Cougars (1-0) and was one of four players in double figures. Miranda Rogers added 16 points for Concordia.

Kassidy Rinehart paced Lawrence (0-1) with 15 points and hit 6-of-7 shots from the floor. Jeannine Schulz added 11 points off the bench for the Vikings. Fanita Robins added nine points and a game-high seven rebounds for the Vikings.

The Cougars jumped out to a 16-4 lead in the first seven minutes and pulled away from there. Concordia pushed the lead to 44-16 at the half.

Lawrence played a much stronger second half by hitting 16-of-28 shots from the floor (57.1 percent) on the way to 41 points after the break.

Concordia shot 47.4 percent from the floor during the game and connected on 15-of-33 attempts from 3-point range.
