►Todd Kent (Eastern Washington 1998) is in his sixth season at UC Santa Cruz and has a record of 59-73 (.447).

THE SERIES

►Lawrence holds a 1-0 lead in the series with Whittier. The teams met in the 2003-04 season, and the Vikings posted a 69-44 victory in a neutral-site game at Occidental. Claire Getzoff poured in 25 points for the Vikings, and Felice Porrata had a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.
 ►This is the first meeting between the Vikings and UC Santa Cruz.

LAST GAME

Lake Forest pulled away late and

posted a 52-37 Midwest Conference victory over visiting Lawrence on Tuesday.

Brie Majkowski scored 14 points and K.C. Stralka added 10 to pace the Foresters.

Danelle Buck scored seven points and grabbed six rebounds for Lawrence. Andrea Wilkinson and Cassidy Rinehart added six points apiece for the Vikings, and Wilkinson had a game-high nine rebounds.

Lawrence, which led by as many as five points in the first half, trailed 25-22 at the break. The Vikings got a three-point play from Rinehart to tie the score at 25-25 before the Foresters pulled out to a 35-27 edge.

Nicole Cummins then scored on a layup and Buck made a free throw to cut the margin back to 35-30 with 12:45 remaining. Lawrence was then hit by a scoring drought that lasted 7:40 as Lake Forest scored the game's next eight points for a 43-30 advantage.

Buck hit a pair of free throws with 5:05 left to cut the lead to 43-32, but Lawrence would get no closer the rest of the way.

VIKINGS UPDATE

▶Lawrence is in the home stretch of the first half of the season. Once the Vikings finish play in California, the Vikings take a 19-day break before returning to action with a Midwest Conference game at Grinnell on Jan. 3.



▶This is the first time Lawrence will play games in California since 2007-08 when the Vikings played San Diego Christian and Point Loma Nazarene.

▶Lawrence's struggles on offense continued in the game at Lake Forest on Tuesday. The Vikings hit just 13-of-51 shots from the floor for 25.5 percent. Lawrence was only 2-of-13 from beyond the arc (15.4 percent).

▶The Vikings do not have a player averaging double figures in points but have four players averaging at least 6.0 points per contest. Freshman forward Danelle Buck (Newton, Wis./Valders) is tops on the squad at 7.3 points per contest, and another first-year player, Elizabeth Arco (Bartlett, Ill./Bartlett) is next at 6.3. Senior guard Cassidy Rinehart (Hortonville, Wis./Hortonville) and junior forward Andrea Wilkinson (Racine, Wis./Lutheran) are at 6.2 and 6.0, respectively.

▶Junior forward Jeannine Schulz (Antioch, Ill./Math and Science) and Arco are tied for tops on the team at 5.5 rebounds per game. Schulz pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds in Lawrence's game at Illinois College on

Dec. 6.

▶Rinehart is tops on the team at 1.8 assists per game, and Wilkinson is next at 1.7.

▶The Vikings should get two players back for the games at Santa Cruz. Junior forward Katie Schumacher (Little Chute, Wis./Little Chute) has been practicing with the team for a week since returning from studying abroad. Arco also hopes to return after missing the last two-plus games due to injury.

▶Lawrence ranks 11th in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 40.7 points per game. The Vikings moved up a spot and now fourth in the league in scoring defense at 61.7 points per contest.

▶The Vikings are 10th in the conference in field goal percentage at 31.6 percent. Lawrence is sixth in field goal percentage defense at 39.1 percent.

▶Lawrence ranks 11th in the conference in 3-point shooting at 22.6 percent, and the Vikings have attempted the fewest 3-pointers in the league with 31. The Vikings are sixth in field goal percentage defense at 28.5 percent.

SCOUTING UC SANTA CRUZ

▶Santa Cruz enters the weekend on a three-game losing streak after starting the campaign with a 5-0 mark. The Banana Slugs are coming off a 61-58 loss at Pacific Lutheran on Dec. 6. Santa Cruz's three losses have come by a total of just 11 points.



▶Santa Cruz will play Whittier on Friday and take on Chapman on Saturday before it faces the Vikings on Sunday. Santa Cruz starts a five-game homestand with the games this weekend.

►Santa Cruz has one of the more unique nicknames, the Banana Slugs, and competes as a NCAA Division III independent. Santa Cruz is located on the coast south of San Francisco.

►Santa Cruz is coming off the best season in program history when the Slugs went 18-7 and put together a 10-game win streak during the season.

►The Slugs have two players averaging double figures in points with Leah Parrish leading the way at 14.9 points per game. Sarah Mackey is at 13.6 points per contest. Parrish also is tops on the squad at 8.4 rebounds per contest.

►Santa Cruz is averaging 61.2 points per game, and the Slugs are giving up a paltry 52.0 points per contest.

►The Slugs are shooting 36.8 percent from the floor, including 31.4 percent from beyond the arc. Opponents are shooting 34.6 percent from the floor and 33.0 percent from 3-point range.

SCOUTING WHITTIER

►Whittier enters the weekend on a two-game winning streak after wins over Bristol (74-60) and Linfield (83-70). The Poets will have to shake off some rust since they haven't played since Nov. 23, a break of 18 days.



►The Poets, yes, Poets, compete in the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Whittier is located in the heart of the metro Los Angeles area and will make the 350-mile trip to Santa Cruz for a pair of games. The Poets take on UC Santa Cruz on Friday before facing the Vikings on Saturday.

►Priscilla Rodriguez is the lone player averaging in double figures for the

►Kaylah Anderson is the top rebounder on the team at 7.5 boards per game to go along with 4.2 points per contest. The Poets lead the league in rebounding average at 46.2 but are a minus-4.0 in rebounding margin.

►Whittier ranks first in the SCIAC in scoring offense at 62.8 points per game. The Poets are seventh in the nine-team conference in scoring defense at 67.5 points per contest.

►Whittier is shooting 31.2 percent, which ranks eighth in the SCIAC. Opponents are shooting 39.4 percent, which ranks fifth in the league in field goal percentage defense.

►The Poets are hitting 27.3 percent of their shots from 3-point range, good for sixth in the conference. Whittier is first in the league in 3-point defense at 15.4 percent.

November 15

Concordia Chicago 95, Lawrence 57

RIVER FOREST, Ill. — The Concordia University Chicago women's basketball team got



off to a fast start and rolled to a 95-57 nonconference victory over Lawrence University at Geiseman Gymnasium.

Lauren Orr scored a game-high 20 points off the bench to pace the Cougars (1-0) and was one of four players in double figures. Miranda Rogers added 16 points for Concordia.

Kassidy Rinehart paced Lawrence (0-1) with 15 points and hit 6-of-7 shots from the floor. Jeannine Schulz added 11 points off the bench for the Vikings. Fanita Robins added nine points and a game-high seven rebounds for the Vikings.

The Cougars jumped out to a 16-4 lead in the first seven minutes and pulled away from there. Concordia pushed the lead to 44-16 at the half.

Lawrence played a much stronger second half by hitting 16-of-28 shots from the floor (57.1 percent) on the way to 41 points after the break.

Concordia shot 47.4 percent from the floor during the game and connected on 15-of-33 attempts from 3-point range.

November 19

Marian 61, Lawrence 38

APPLETON, Wis.

-- The Marian University women's basketball team built a big first-half lead and



went on to a 61-38 nonconference victory over Lawrence University at Alexander Gymnasium.

Amelia Mirsberger led Marian (1-0) and all scorers with 18 points as she hit 6-of-8 shots from the floor and went 4-for-4 from the foul line. Sarah Olewinski added 12 points for the Sabres.

Elizabeth Arco paced the Vikings

(0-2) with nine points and six rebounds, and Jeannine Schulz added eight points.

Marian trailed early but went on an 18-2 run in the first half to pull out to a 20-7 lead with 9:14 left in the first half. Mirsberger scored nine points in the first half as the Sabres built a 32-16 advantage at the break.

The Vikings chipped away at the lead over the first nine minutes of the second half. Lawrence outscored the Sabres 13-8 to open the half, capped by Arco's layup, to trim the lead to 40-29. Arco scored four points in that run and Schulz had three.

Marian responded by going on a 16-4 run to grab a 56-33 lead and seal the victory.

November 22

Ripon 41, Lawrence 40

-- The Lawrence University women's basket-



ball team scored just one point over the final 11 minutes and endured a horrendous afternoon at the foul line in a 41-40 Midwest Conference loss to Ripon College at Alexander Gymnasium.

Ripon (1-2, 1-0 MWC) got two free throws from Meg Ryan with 30 seconds left to take the lead, and freshman guard Lauren Deveikis missed a jumper with five seconds left that would have won it for Lawrence (0-3, 0-1).

Both teams had a rough time at the foul line as Lawrence connected on only 9-of-22 from the stripe and Ripon hit just 9-of-21.

Freshman Danelle Buck led Lawrence with 11 points and she picked up seven rebounds. Freshman forward Elizabeth Arco pulled down 10 rebounds and added eight points for the Vikings. Andrea Wilkinson chipped in with nine points for the Vikings.

Ryan, McKenzie Banasik and Nicole Herkert scored 10 points apiece to pace Ripon, and Herkert had a

game-high 13 rebounds.

Lawrence led throughout most of the contest as the Vikings took their first lead at 7-5 on Arco's three-point play with 13:15 left in the first half. Lawrence would build that advantage to as much as nine points before the Red Hawks trimmed the lead to 28-22 at the half.

The Vikings grabbed their biggest lead of the game by going on a 6-0 run, capped by Natalie Kramer's layup and an Arco free throw with 11:07 left, for a 39-27 edge.

Ripon began chipping away at the advantage as the Vikings went ice cold from the floor and the foul line. Lawrence finished the game by going 0-for-11 from the floor and 1-for-5 from the line.

Lawrence's only points in that stretch came on Kassidy Rinehart's free throw with 4:51 remaining that gave the Vikings a 40-35 lead. Ripon got a layup from Chelsea Moldenhauer and a couple of free throws from Banasik to cut the lead to 40-39.

The Vikings then committed three consecutive turnovers before fouling Ryan. She hit both free throws to give Ripon the lead for good.

December 3

Beloit 51, Lawrence 31

-- The Lawrence University women's basketball team



endured a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes in a 51-31 Midwest Conference loss to Beloit College at Alexander Gymnasium.

Lana Wieseman led Beloit (3-3, 2-1 MWC) with 18 points and nine rebounds, and Laura Panicali added 13 points and nine boards.

Andrea Wilkinson came off the bench to score eight points for the Vikings (0-4, 0-2). The Vikings hit just 12-of-51 shots (23.5 percent) from the floor.

Lawrence had battled back in the

Illinois College 70, Lawrence 41

JACKSONVILLE, Ill. -- Reigning league Player of the Year Hannah McGinnis posted a double-double to lead the Illinois



College women's basketball team to a 70-41 league Midwest Conference victory over Lawrence University at Sherman Gymnasium.

McGinnis scored 19 points and grabbed 15 rebounds to go with four assists to lead the Lady Blues (4-2, 2-0 MWC).

Danelle Buck paced Lawrence (0-5, 0-3) with 10 points, and she grabbed seven rebounds. Jeannine Schulz picked up a team-high 10 rebounds for the Vikings.

Lawrence trailed by double digits twice in the first half before trimming Illinois College's lead to 29-21 at the half.

The Lady Blues led 35-25 early in the second half after Buck's jumper with 16:35 left. Illinois College then went on a 17-7 run over the next six minutes to expand the advantage to 52-32 with 10:48 remaining.

Lawrence, which led by as many as five points in the first half, trailed 25-22 at the break. The Vikings got a three-point play from Rinehart to tie the score at 25-25 before the Foresters pulled out to a 35-27 edge.

Nicole Cummins then scored on a layup and Buck made a free throw to cut the margin back to 35-30 with 12:45 remaining. Lawrence was then hit by a scoring drought that lasted 7:40 as Lake Forest scored the game's next eight points for a 43-30 advantage.

Buck hit a pair of free throws with 5:05 left to cut the lead to 43-32, but Lawrence would get no closer the rest of the way.
