►Jennifer McCormick (Elmhurst 2004) is in her fifth season at Beloit and has a record of 26-71 (.268).

►Lora Westling (Washburn 2005) is in her third season at Illinois College and has a record of 29-23 (.558).

### THE SERIES

►Beloit holds a 34-28 edge in the series that started in the 1977-78 season. The Bucs have won 14 consecutive games in the series. Prior to that, Lawrence had won six in a row.

►The series with Illinois College, which was first played in the 1991-92 season, is tied at 18-18. The Lady Blues

have won the last four meetings, and Lawrence's last victory was a 56-53 triumph during the 2012-13 season.

### LAST GAME

Lake Forest jumped out to a 12-0 lead and went on to a 60-36 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence on Nov. 25 at Alexander Gymnasium.

K.C. Stralka posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds for the Foresters. Brie Majkowski, Michelle Ricolcol and Brittany Avonts had eight points apiece for Lake Forest.

Liz Arco scored a game-high 12 points to pace Lawrence, and Andrea Wilkinson added eight points.

The Foresters kept Lawrence off the board until Sammi Jo Nixon's 3-pointer with 3:41 left in the opening quarter trimmed the margin to 12-3. Lake Forest would go on to lead 15-7 after the opening 10 minutes.

The Vikings got a layup from Arco and a 3-pointer from Patsy Kealey to cut the lead to 15-12 with 8:40 left in the second quarter. Lake Forest finished the first half on a 10-2 run and pushed the lead to 25-14 at the half.

The Foresters pushed the lead to 20 points late in the third quarter and would go on to lead by as many as 26 points in the final period.

### VIKINGS UPDATE

►After being held scoreless in the opener, sophomore forward Liz Arco (Bartlett, Ill./Bartlett) has averaged 15.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists in the past two games. She leads the team in scoring at 10.0 points per contest while shooting 40.6 percent from the floor.



►Senior forward Andrea Wilkinson (Racine, Wis./Lutheran) leads the team in rebounding at 5.7 per game. She also ranks second on the team at 7.3 points per contest.

►Sophomore guard Fanita Robins (Chicago, Ill./Providence St. Mel) posted the second double-figure scoring game of her career when she scored 11 points at Ripon on Nov. 21.

Robins scored a career-high 12 points vs. Whittier on Dec. 13, 2014. Robins is now averaging 5.7 points per game this season.

►The Vikings added to their family when head coach Ashley Wellman and her husband, Tyler, welcomed

their first child. Coach Wellman had a son, Jack, on Nov. 19. Congratulations to Ashley and Tyler!

►The Vikings are 11th in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 40.3 points per game. Lawrence is fifth in scoring defense at 63.7 points per contest.

►Lawrence is shooting 31.3 percent from the floor, which ranks 11th in the conference. The Vikings are ninth in field goal percentage defense at 42.4 percent.

►The Vikings are eighth in the league in 3-point shooting at 26.7 percent. Lawrence ranks sixth in defending the 3-pointer at 31.6 percent.

►Lawrence ranks 11th in the conference in free-throw shooting at 53.1 percent.

### SCOUTING BELOIT

►Beloit saw its modest two-game win streak snapped this past Saturday with an 82-78 loss at Grinnell. Laura Panicali poured in 27 points for the Bucs, and Lane Wiseman added 26. Grinnell led by nine with four minutes left before Beloit rallied. The Bucs cut the lead to 79-78 in the final 30 seconds before Grinnell hung on for the victory.



►Junior Laura Panicali was named the Midwest Conference Player of the Week after Beloit split a pair of games last week. Panicali averaged 25.5 points per game while shooting 65.5 percent from the floor. In addition to the close loss at Grinnell, Beloit also defeated Carroll last week.

►Lana Wieseman and Laura Panicali rank 1-2 in the Midwest Conference in scoring. Wieseman is first at 21.0 points per game, and Panicali is next at 20.3. Wieseman also is the top rebounder on the team and ranks sixth in the league at 7.0 per game. She is

tied with teammate Nora Polaski for the top rebounding spot on the team.

►Beloit is scoring 76.8 points per game, which ranks second in the Midwest Conference. The Bucs are ninth in scoring defense at 69.5 points per game.

►Beloit is fifth in the league in free-throw shooting at 67.4 percent.

►The Bucs tops in the Midwest Conference in shooting at 46.0 percent. Beloit ranks fifth in field goal percentage defense at 40.5 percent.

►Beloit leads the league in 3-point shooting at 38.6 percent. The Bucs are fifth in 3-point defense at 30.8 percent.

### SCOUTING ILLINOIS COLLEGE

►After winning three straight to start the season, the Lady Blues have dropped their last two games. Illinois College lost 69-51 to Washington University and then fell 76-67 to Illinois Wesleyan. Both of those games were part of the Midwest Invitational in St. Louis, Mo.



►With All-American Hannah McGinnis lost to graduation, the Lady Blues have had several people step into that void. Sophomore Melissa Solorio, who didn't play in IC's last game, is tops on the team in scoring at 15.3 points per game and leads the team in rebounding at 6.0 per contest. Guard Jill Friedrich is second on the team in scoring at 13.4 points per game and leads the team at 2.2 assists per game.

►Illinois College is averaging 67.6 points per game, good for fifth in the Midwest Conference. The Lady Blues are sixth in scoring defense at 63.8 points per game.

►The Lady Blues are seventh in the

►The Lady Blues are shooting 30.9 percent from beyond the arc, and that is fifth in the conference. Illinois College ranks third in 3-point defense at 26.8 percent.

## 2015-16 Game Recaps

**November 17**

**Marian 57, Lawrence 28**

FOND DU LAC, Wis. — The Lawrence University women's basketball team struggled out of the gate and Marian University posted a 57-28 non-conference victory in the season opener at Sadoff Gymnasium.



Marian bolted to a 25-7 lead after the first quarter, and the Sabres led 36-10 at the half.

Nicole Paulus led Marian and all scorers with 19 points, and Brittany Bauman added 11.

Andrea Wilkinson led Lawrence with eight points and pulled down a game-high 12 rebounds to go along with three steals. The Vikings hit on only 10-of-48 shots from the floor (20.8 percent), and Lawrence shot just 2-of-13 (15.4 percent) from beyond the arc.

Marian opened the second half by scoring 11 consecutive points to push the lead to 47-10 and never led by less than 27 points the rest of the way.

**November 21**

**Ripon 74, Lawrence 57**

RIPON, Wis. — The Ripon College women's basketball team pulled away in the second quarter and kept Lawrence University at bay the rest of the game in a 74-57 Midwest Conference victory at the Storzer Center.



Freshman Maggie Oimoen scored 22 points on 11-of-14 shooting to pace Ripon (2-0, 1-0 MWC).

Liz Arco came off the bench to pace Lawrence (0-2, 0-1) with 18 points, eight rebounds and five assists. Fanita Robins and Olivia Hoesley added 11 points apiece for Lawrence.

Ripon led 15-14 late in the first quarter, but the Red Hawks scored eight consecutive points. The game then see-sawed as Lawrence trimmed the lead back seven before Ripon stretched it all the way to 33-16.

Hoesley then hit a 3-pointer, Robins connected on back-to-back jumpers and Arco hit a jumper to cut the lead to 37-25 at the half.

Lawrence was unable to put a dent in Ripon's lead in the final two quarters. The Vikings never got closer than 10 points, but Ripon didn't pull away.

Lawrence cut the lead to 62-51 on Natalie Kramer's 3-pointer with 5:47 left in the fourth quarter before Ripon finally put the game away in the final minutes.
