THE COACHES

Ashley Wellman (Alma 2008) is in

her third season at Lawrence and has a record of 6-65 (.085). ▶ Jennifer McCormick (Elmhurst 2004) is in her first season at Illinois College. She is in her sixth Ashley Wellman season overall and



has a record of 35-84 (.294).

Emily Cline (Cornell 2001) is in her ninth season at Knox and has a record of 65-122 (.348).

THE SERIES

▶Illinois College holds a 20–18 edge in a series that started in 1991-92. The Lady Blues have won six straight, and Lawrence's last victory was a 56-53 victory at Alexander Gymnasium in the 2012-13 season.

Lawrence holds a 19-18 advantage over Knox in a series that started in the 1989-90 season. The Prairie Fire has won four in a row, and Lawrence's last victory was a 93-92 win during the 2013-14 season.

LAST GAME

Lauren Deveikis buried a 3-pointer with 4.2 seconds left to lift Lawrence to a 51-48 nonconference win over Marian on Nov. 17 at Alexander Gymnasium.

Olivia Hoesley led Lawrence and all scorers with a career-high 19

points as the Vikings improved to 2-0 on the season. Leah Reeves added nine points and a teamhigh eight rebounds for the Vikings, and Minogue Lauren Deveikis Grace chipped in with sev-



en points, five rebounds, five assists and four steals.

Nicole Paulus paced Marian with 18 points, nine rebounds and five assists. Carley Wilson came off the bench to add 10 points and nine boards.

Lawrence had its biggest lead of the fourth quarter after Minoque's three-point play put the Vikings up 44-38 with 5:16 left. Paulus scored the next six points for Marian to cut the margin to 46-44.

Hoesley countered with a jumper for the Vikings, but Wilson hit a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 48-47 with 1:36 remaining. The teams exchanged missed shots before Wilson was fouled with 11 seconds left. She made one free throw to tie the game at 48-48.

The Vikings took a timeout to set up the final play and Minogue drove to the right side of the lane. Minogue was nearly knocked down by a Marian player but got the ball to Deveikis, who drained the 3-pointer from the corner for the win.

Paulus got off a desperation 3-pointer at the buzzer that was well off the mark.

Lawrence jumped out to an early

7-0 lead with the help of five points from Hoesley. The Sabres rallied and trimmed the lead to 20-14 after the first quarter. Lawrence went ice cold in the second guarter and was limited to just two points as Marian took a 26-22 lead at the half.

The Vikings bounced back in the third guarter and went on an 11-1 run, capped by Nicole Cummins' 3-pointer, to grab a 33-27 edge. The Vikings would lead 35-31 after three quarters.

VIKINGS UPDATE

The Vikings have started a season with a 2-0 record for the first time since the 2005-06 campaign. This also is the

first time the Vikings have won backto-back games since defeating the University of Dallas and Maranatha Baptist during the 2009-10 season.

Junior guard Olivia Hoesley (Eau Claire, Wis./North) leads the team in scoring at 13.5 points per game and is shooting a very good 47.8 percent from the floor. As good as that is, Hoesley is hitting a sizzling 66.7 percent (10-15) of her shots from inside the arc. Hoesley scored a career-high 19 points in the win over Marian, topping her previous high of 13 at Monmouth during the 2014-15 season.

Junior guard Nicole Cummins (San Antonio, Texas/John Marshall) scored

a career-high 15 points in the season-opening win at Maranatha. Cummins eclipsed her previous best of 11, which came against Lake Forest during Nicole Cummins her rookie season in



2014-15. Cummins is second on the team in scoring at 10.0 points per game.

Sophomore forward Leah Reeves (Lisle, III./Lisle) is tops on the team at 7.5 rebounds per game and matched her career high with eight boards vs. Marian. Rookie Shonell Benjamin (Brooklyn, N.Y./Latin School) leads the squad at 4.0 assists per game, and Natalie Kramer (Mendota Heights, Minn./Henry Sibley) has a team-best six steals.

The Vikings rank second in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense by allowing only 49.5 points per game. The Vikings are ninth in scoring at 56.0 points per game.

Lawrence is first in the league in field goal percentage defense at 29.0 percent. Lawrence is ninth in the league in shooting at 33.1 percent.

The Vikings are second in the league



in defending the 3-pointer at 25.7 percent. Lawrence is ninth in the conference in 3-point shooting at 23.3 percent.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS COLLEGE

▶Illinois College has dropped two straight after winning its first two games of the season. The Lady Blues are coming off a 72-55 loss to DePauw on



a neutral court this past Sunday. Illinois College won its Midwest Conference opener 84-74 over Monmouth back on Nov. 22.

The Lady Blues have a new coach but a familiar face from the league. Former Beloit coach Jennifer McCormick took over in Jacksonville after coaching the Bucs for five seasons.

Sophomore Brielle Greenleaf is averaging a team-best 20.8 points per game while shooting 60 percent from the floor. Carly Cameron is tops in rebounding at 6.3 per game and second in scoring at 12.8 points per game.

Illinois College is averaging 68.8 points per game, good for third in the conference. The Lady Blues are allowing 71.3 points, which ranks eighth in the conference.

▶Illinois College is second in the league in shooting at 43.3 percent and third in 3-point shooting at 33.8. The Lady Blues rank ninth in field goal percentage defense at 46.3 percent and seventh against the 3-pointer at 35.8.

SCOUTING KNOX

Knox sandwiched its one win, an 88-62 victory over Robert Morris-Peoria, around two



losses to Eureka this season.

Knox is in the midst of a five-game homestand that lasts until Dec. 7. The

►Kyra Huffman is leading Knox in both scoring and rebounding. Huffman is at 15 points and 8.3 rebounds per game. Karlie Thorn (11.3 ppg) and Taliah Ellis (10 ppg) are also scoring in double figures.

Guard Naja Woods in tops in the Midwest Conference at 7.7 assists per game.

Knox leads the Midwest Conference in scoring at 76 points per game, and the Prairie Fire is allowing 78.7 per game, which ranks ninth in the league.

Knox is shooting 39.3 percent from the floor, good for fifth in the conference. Knox is sixth in field goal percentage defense at 41.8 percent.

Knox is last in the league in 3-point shooting at 22.8 percent, and the Prairie Fire ranks sixth in defending the 3-pointer at 32.3 percent.
