►Ashley Wellman (Alma 2008) is in her third season at Lawrence and has a record of 6-69 (.080). Alisa Kintner (Delaware Valley 2001) is in her 14th season Ashley Wellman at Widener and has a record of 204-151 (.575).



Andrea Kendall (Neumann 2005) is in her first season at Randolph and has a record of 5-3 (.625). She is in her second season overall and has a record of 19-16 (.543).

LAST GAME

Kayla Morrissey's double-double led Grinnell to a 65-44 Midwest Conference victory over Lawrence on Saturday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Lawrence freshman Shonell Benjamin posted her first career doubledouble with season highs of 15 points and 10 rebounds for the Vikings.

The Pioneers got the advantage in the second guarter and then stretched the lead in the third period. Lawrence wasn't able to mount a comeback in the second half.

The Vikings hung with Grinnell early as Lawrence finished the first guarter on an 8-2 run that tied the game at 10-10 after one. After Benjamin's three-point play to start the second, Lawrence grabbed a 13-12 advantage.

Grinnell took control in the final five minutes of the second guarter as 3-pointers from Ariel Keller, Sophia Gatton and Daria Guzzo staked the Pioneers to a 30-21 lead at the half.

Grinnell steadily increased the advantage in the third guarter and led by as many as 19 points before settling for a 50-32 lead after three. The Pioneers would lead by as many as 24 points in the final quarter.

Foul trouble plaqued Lawrence lone player with size, Leah Reeves. She managed eight points on 4-of-5 shooting to go with four rebounds in just 14 minutes before fouling out. The Vikings also were ice cold from beyond the arc, hitting just 1-of-16 from long range.

VIKINGS UPDATE

The Vikings have really gone cold from distance over the past three games. After shooting 27.5 percent (11-40) from 3-point range in the



first three games, Lawrence has connected on just 6-of-44 shots (13.6 percent) from long range in the last three contests.

Widener vs. St. Norbert

▶Freshman guard Shonell Benjamin (Brooklyn, N.Y./Latin School) turned in the best game of her young career with her first career double-double against Shonell Benjamin

Grinnell. Benjamin



was 4-for-8 from the floor and 7-of-10 from the foul line on her way to 15 points. She also grabbed 10 rebounds, the second time she has done that this season. Benjamin is now averaging 4.5 points and a team-high 6.3 rebounds per game.

Junior guard Olivia Hoesley (Eau

Claire, Wis./North) leads a balanced attack for the Vikings. Hoesley is averaging 7.5 points per game and is one of seven players averaging at least 4.5 points per game.

Sophomore forward Leah Reeves (Lisle, III./Lisle) looked like she was set to have a huge game against Grinnell but foul trouble limited her to just 14 minutes before she fouled out. Reeves scored eight points on 4-of-5 shooting and grabbed four rebounds. She's now averaging 6.7 points and 5.8 rebounds per game.

Rookie guard Grace Minogue (Chicago, III./Jones Prep) has been a steady performer early in her season. first Minoque is third on the team in scoring at Grace Minogue 6.3 points per game while shooting 33.3



percent from the floor. Minoque is the team's top 3-point shooter at 28.6 percent.

The Vikings rank eighth in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense at 67.2 points per game. The Vikings are 10th in scoring at 44.2 points per game.

Lawrence is fourth in the league in field goal percentage defense at 37.3 percent. Lawrence is hitting 27.8 percent of its shots from the floor, and that ranks 10th in the conference.

The Vikings are second in the Midwest Conference in defending the 3-pointer at 26.8 percent. Lawrence is 10th in the conference in 3-point shooting at 20.2 percent.

SCOUTING WIDENER

▶Widener is coming off a 93-73 loss to Rowan on Tuesday. Devan Rimmer scored 17



points and Angelica Borja added 15 in a losing effort for the Pride.

Widener, members of the Middle Atlantic Conference, is located in Chester, Pa. Chester's most famous basketball son is former Wisconsin coach Bo Ryan.

Devan Rimmer is one of three players scoring in double figures for Widener. She is at 13.6 points per game. Madison Ireland is at 10.8 points and leads the team at 4.8 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game. Allison Gallagher is next at 10.6 points per contest.

Nikki Petri is the top 3-point shooter on the team at 14-for-24 for an impressive 58.3 percent.

Widener is averaging 71.9 points per game, and the Pride is giving up 77.7 per game.

Widener is shooting 37.3 percent from the floor, but opponents are shooting at 44.4 percent clip.

Widener is hitting 36.5 percent on 3-pointers and opponents are at 36.6 percent from beyond the arc.

SCOUTING RANDOLPH

▶Randolph won its third consecutive game with an 86-40 rout of Mary Baldwin this past Saturday. Alexis Calloway



scored 19 points to lead three Wildcats in double figures.

Randolph is located in Lynchburg, Va., and the Wildcats are members of the Old Dominion Athletic Conference.

The Wildcats are off to a good start for first-year head coach Andrea Kendall, who is in her second season as a head coach.

Korin Harris is the lone Randolph player averaging double figures in points at 11.4 per game.

Forward Alexis Callaway is close to averaging a double-double as she

leads the squad at 10.0 rebounds per game and is second in scoring at 9.4 points per contest.

The Wildcats have attempted just 70 3-pointers through eight games this season. The top shooter for the Wildcats is Danielle Rizzari, who is 7-for-30 from beyond the arc. Randoph is shooting 25.7 percent on 3-pointers this season. Opponents are hitting 40.0 percent of their 3-pointers.

Randolph is averaging 65.6 points per game and allowing 79.0.

The Wildcats are shooting 36.5 percent from the floor while opponents are shooting 38.7 percent.
