- How can we understand the nature of "The Way?" Find descriptions and metaphors that help us get a sense of what is meant by this concept.
- Highlight what you think are interesting, amusing, significant stories. What are his readers to learn from these stories? Bring a list of two or three of your favorites.
- Here are some themes to consider as you read the rest (and re-reader the early portions) of Zhuangzi's *Basic Writings*:

 - 2. Use of the useless
 - 3. Fame and success
 - 4. Knowledge and wisdom
 - 5. Skill
 - 6. Fate and fortune/misfortune
 - 7. Emotions: happiness and misery
 - 8. Virtue
